## **Current Progress on Additional Indicators**

- Over the summer, IAEG Members held several rounds of internal consultations seeking to identify not only indicators that needed refinements, but also targets where additional indicators may be necessary.
- IAEG Members identified a total of 36 possible additional indicators.
- IAEG Members decided to postpone future work on these additional indicators temporarily in order to focus their work on presenting a proposal for refinements to the Statistical Commission.

## **Proposed Work Plan on Additional Indicators (1)**

- Work on the additional indicators will take place during 2017 for presentation at the 49<sup>th</sup> session of UNSC.
- IAEG Members will review the current list of 36 possible additional indicators to decide which to include in an open consultation.
- For targets where the IAEG has identified the need for an additional indicator but has yet to identify a proposal, IAEG may request proposals from agencies that work in that area.
- An open consultation on the proposed possible additional indicators will subsequently be launched, similar to the recently concluded consultation on the indicator refinements

## **Proposed Work Plan on Additional Indicators (2)**

- IAEG Members will review the results of the consultation, and among proposals that equally address the same issue, IAEG Members may give preference to those proposals with an established methodology and with data available.
- IAEG Members will finalize a list of proposed additional indicators to present to the 49<sup>th</sup> session of the Statistical Commission for its consideration in March 2018.
