

8. PREPARE MENTALLY FOR FIELDWORK

- Envisage problems to be anticipated
- Prepare for communication problems (translators)
- How to deal with alternative views of informants (different age groups, locations, gender)
- The objects the topographer and the informants want names for might not overlap (different spatial concepts/no existing names)
- Name alteration over time and space (local variation)
