

TREATMENT OF ANY "UNFINISHED BUSINESS" OF
THE FORMER ACC SUBCOMMITTEE ON STATISTICAL ACTIVITIES

Note by the Secretariat

1. The Subcommittee held its thirty-fifth (and last) session from 18-20 September 2001. The report of the session is in ACC/2001/2.
 2. There were matters in the above report on which further actions were expected to be taken at a 2002 session of the Subcommittee. All those matters are set out in the Annex to this note and the particular agenda item under which each matter will be taken up at the present meeting is indicated.
 3. All but two issues are covered under other agenda items; those two issues should be addressed under the present agenda item; they are: (a) Good practices in citation in the outputs of international statistical offices and (b) identifying issues that the Statistical Commission may wish to discuss: "Collection of disaggregated statistics by international organizations (including the uses of disaggregated statistics and the reporting burdens on countries). These were initially included on the agenda of the (planned) ACC Subcommittee on Statistical Activities meeting of 17-19 September 2002 but they were not placed on the agenda of the current meeting in an effort to streamline the agenda. The meeting should decide what further action, if any, to take on these matters.
