STATEC

In accordance with the provisions of Article 18 of the law of 31 March 1979 on the use of personal data in data processing, we wish to inform respondents of the following facts

- a) The purpose of the processing of this data is to compile statistics on the personal and socio-economic circumstances of individuals as well as their living conditions
- b) Under the terms of the law of 9 July 1962 establishing a Central Service for Statistics and Economic Studies (STATEC), respondents are obliged to answer this questionnaire

QUESTION IS THIS DWELLING YOUR NORMAL PLACE OF RESIDENCE?

NORMAL PLACE OF RESIDENCE

The normal place of residence is the place where various persons forming a household live together or the place where a single person forming a household by himself/herself usually lives. The address of this place is usually the address under which the person is registered with their commune.

QUESTION WHERE DO YOU WORK?

Most organisations perform a single activity. Nevertheless, some companies have two or more divisions, in other words, they perform two or more different activities. If this is the case, respondents should specify the division in which they work

QUESTION WHAT IS YOUR EMPLOYMENT STATUS?

FAMILY HELPER

A family helper is any respondent who usually helps another member of the household with their work without being paid a normal wage. Family helpers are usually found in agriculture, cottage industries and small commercial companies. It usually involves the company owner's spouse or child, or even their father, mother, brother, sister, uncle, etc.
