REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE STATISTICS ACT, 1976:
COLLECTION OF STATISTICS IN RELATION TO LABOUR FORCE
ACTIVITIES

The President has under section 17 of the Statistics Act, 1976 (Act No. 66 of 1976), made the regulations set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise indicates, an expression defined in the Statistics Act, 1976 (Act No. 66 of 1976) has a corresponding meaning and -

“head of household” means the person responsible for the management of the affairs of the household;

“household” means all persons living in the same dwelling unit and any person temporarily absent from that dwelling unit.

Furnishing of statistics

2. (1) Every head of a household shall furnish orally to the Secretary, in relation to every member of that household, the following statistics:

- (a) Name;
- (b) relationship to the head of the household;
- (c) sex;
- (d) age;
- (e) nationality;
- (f) marital status;
- (g) educational attainment;
- (h) usual and current economic activity engaged in;
- (i) membership status with regard to the Social Security Commission;
- (j) membership status with regard to any -
 - (i) workers’ union;
 - (ii) employer’s union;
 - (iii) farmers’ union;
- (k) employment status and -
 - (i) if unemployed, but seeking employment, statistics with regard to the following:

- (aa) Work search methods used to seek employment;
- (bb) type of work that is being sought;
- (cc) duration of unemployment;
- (dd) previous occupation held;
- (ii) if employed, statistics with regard to the following:
 - (aa) Occupation held;
 - (bb) industry in which employed;
 - (cc) usual and actual working hours;
 - (dd) preferred working hours.

(2) The statistics referred to in subregulation (1) shall be furnished during the period of 6 August 2004 to 30 September 2004.

Offences and penalties

3. Any person who, without reasonable cause, contravenes or fails to comply with these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding N\$200 or, in the case of a continuing failure to comply with the regulations, to a fine not exceeding N\$10 for every day during which the failure continues.
