STATUTE OF THE UNITED NATIONS GROUP OF EXPERTS ON GEOGRAPHIC NAMES

DRAFT REVISION, AUGUST 28, 1992

<u>AIMS</u>

The basic aims of the Group of Experts are:

- (a) To emphasize the importance of the 1991 (a) standardization of geographical names at the national and international levels and to demonstrate the benefits to be derived from such standardization.
- (b) To collect the results of the work of old (b) & of national and international bodies dealing 1991 (c) with the standardization of geographical names and to facilitate the dissemination of these results to Member States of the United Nations.
- (c) To study and propose principles, policies and old (a) & methods suitable for resolving problems of 1991 (b) national and international standardization.

- (d) To play an active role, by facilitating the old (d) & supply of scientific and technical help, in 1991 (e) particular to developing countries, in creating mechanisms for the national and international standardization of geographical names.
- (e) To provide a vehicle for liaison and coordination old (a) & among Member States, and between Member States (b) of and international organizations, on work functions associated with the standardization of geographical names.
- (f) To implement the tasks assigned as a result of 1991 (d) the resolutions adopted at United Nations Conferences on the Standardization of Geographical Names.

PRINCIPLES

FUNCTIONS

The functions of the Group of Experts are:

(a) To develop procedures and establish mechanisms 1991
for standardization in response to national (a) (c)
requirements and particular requests.

- (b) To undertake preparatory work for the periodic old (c) international conferences on the standardization (d) (e) of geographical names; to provide continuity for activities between conferences; and to provide leadership in the implementation of resolutions adopted at the conferences.
- (c) To encourage the discussion and study of 1991 practical and theoretical steps directed towards (b) standardization.
- (d) To coordinate the activities of linguistic/ old (f) geographic divisions formed to further the work (g) (i) at the national level; to encourage the active participation of countries and divisions; and to promote a degree of uniformity in the work undertaken.
- (e) To create any necessary structure to supplement 1991the work of divisions and to deal with issues (d)beyond the scope of a division.
- (f) To develop appropriate programmes to assist with 1991 training in individual countries and group of (f) countries, to achieve standardization where this is lacking.

- (g) To make mapping organizations aware of the new importance of using standardized geographical names.
- (h) To maintain liaison with international old (h) organizations dealing with related subjects & (j) and encourage UNGEGN divisions to participate in the United Nations regional or other cartographic conferences.
- (i) To work at the highest possible national, 1991 international and United Nations levels to (e) interrelate toponymy and cartography.
- (j) To make standardization principles and 1991 standardized geographical names available (g) as practical information for as wide a user community as possible, through all appropriate media.
