## Automated data-processing systems for geographical names in Japan

## Summary\*\*

In Japan, there are various geographical names databases that are provided either free of charge or for a fee. These databases include not only a list of geographical names, but also such information as pronunciation, code numbers and locations that can easily be accessed. Examples include:

- (a) Geographical names database for administrative units and residential districts containing:
  - (i) Administrative code numbers that correspond to each municipality in Japan;
  - (ii) Files on "town divisions" (cho) and "village blocks" (aza);
  - (b) Geographical names database with geographical coordinates containing:
  - (i) Residential block, level, location reference information;
  - (ii) Digital basic map of Japan (geographical name information);
  - (iii) Residential addresses designated by the Act on the indication of residential addresses.
