## TOPONYMIC GUIDELINES

Toponymic directions
(Central, East and Southeast European Division)

It appeared from the reports submitted to the 10<sup>th</sup> session of the UN Regional Group X /Prague, June 1991/ by its member states that the recommendations Nr.IV/4, V/5 and V/14 issued by the UN conferences have not been followed satisfyingly. The Principles of Geographical Names Creation in Poland incorporated into the publication entitled Nazwy geograficzne rzeczypospolitej polskiej /1991/ have merely part-way met the requirements which were postulated by recommendations for toponymic directions publishing. Hungary has been preparing an revised edition of the toponymic directions first published in 1981; the CSFR published the toponymic directions in 1987. In Bulgaria no changes have been recorded since the last session of the Regional Group X.

At the 10<sup>th</sup> session of the Regional Group X /1991/ those member states which had not published any toponymic directions till then were recommended to approach to their publishing. Participants of the discussion undertook to respect the recommendations of the 9<sup>th</sup> session of the Regional Group X /1991; agenda item 6/ when elaborating or updating the toponymic directions and moreover, to complement them with regulations for contradistinguishing between toponyms and the maps non-toponymic text.
