Romanization of Bulgarian, Russian and Mongolian geographical names

Bulgarian

At the January 1975 Budapest meeting of the East Central and South East Europe - Soviet Union Divisions, the Bulgarian delegation submitted the information that the Romanization System approved at the 1972 London Conference became an official standard for cartographic purposes in Bulgaria. The alternative group of characters annexed to the London Resolution, can be used in telecommunication only.

Russian

Also at the Eudapest meeting, the delegate of the Soviet Union submitted information on a Soviet romanization standard published in 1973 giving a further possibility for the use of the romanization system applied in cartography /e.g. on the World Map, Scale 1:2,500,000/. A more detailed review of this standard will be given orally at the Sixth session by the Soviet delegate.
