



Workshops for African countries on the implementation of International Recommendations for Distributive Trade Statistics

Purpose of the questionnaire

The purpose of this questionnaire is to collect information on African countries practices in compilation of distributive trade statistics. It is therefore designed in a format allowing further aggregation of the responses and cross-country comparisons. The information obtained from this questionnaire will be used in a number of ways, including for:

- Assessment of the current status in compilation of annual and short-term distributive trade statistics in African countries in terms of their scope, coverage, timeliness and compliance with relevant international recommendations;
- Identifying challenges and good practices in collection, compilation and dissemination of distributive trade statistics in African region;
- Providing inputs for the preparation of future manuals that will assist compilers of distributive trade statistics.

Scope of distributive trade statistics

The *scope of distributive trade statistics* is defined as statistics reflecting characteristics and activities of the units belonging to distributive trade sector of an economy. The *scope of distributive trade sector* is defined in terms of ISIC, Rev.4 as comprising all resident entities recognised as statistical units and classifiable in section G “Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles”, irrespective of their size, form of economic and legal organization and ownership. Distributive trade activities carried out by entities not classified in Section G of ISIC, Rev.4 are not covered by distributive trade statistics.

By convention, the data items falling within the scope of distributive trade statistics are those reflecting: (i) the characteristics of entities belonging to the distributive trade sector; (ii) receipts and other revenues and purchases of those entities which are recorded in their profit and loss statements and used for calculation of trade output, intermediate consumption and value added; (iii) investment of entities in non-financial assets and changes in inventories; and (iv) employment information which is closely related to the most of previous groups of items. Other data items such as, for example, data items on financial position of the entities are explicitly excluded. They are compiled as a part of financial or other relevant statistics.
