## **Annotations**

### **1. Election of officers**

In accordance with rule 15 of the rules of procedure of the functional commissions of the Economic and Social Council and past practices, the Statistical Commission, at the commencement of its first meeting of a regular session, shall elect, from among the representatives of its members, a Chairman, three Vice-Chairmen and a Rapporteur (the Bureau).

The Bureau serves for two years, as far as possible. This is achieved by electing the Bureau for a period of one year and re-electing those members of the Bureau who continue to be representatives to the Commission at the following session. The Bureau is elected based on the principle of equitable geographical distribution — a member of the Bureau is elected from each of the regions represented on the Commission.

### **2. Adoption of the agenda and other organizational matters**

The items on the provisional agenda and the corresponding documentation were proposed by the Commission at its thirty-seventh session (New York, 7-10 March 2006)<sup>1</sup> and were adopted by the Economic and Social Council in its decision 2006/232. The Bureau of the Commission has subsequently approved some changes. The proposed draft organization of work and a note on the state of preparation of documentation for the session are before the Commission. The Commission may wish to adopt the agenda and organization of work for its thirty-eighth session.

### **3. Items for discussion and decision**

#### **(a) Programme review: education statistics**

The Statistical Commission will have before it a report prepared by Statistics Canada, containing a programme review of education statistics. The report presents the current situation, analyses the challenges and provides specific recommendations. The Commission may wish to express its views on the findings, conclusions and recommendations for future work in this area.

#### **(b) Population and housing censuses**

The Statistical Commission will have before it the report of the Secretary-General on population and housing censuses. The report summarizes activities completed in response to actions taken by the Commission at its thirty-sixth session with regard to the implementation of the 2010 World Programme on Population and Housing Censuses, including the revision of the United Nations *Principles and Recommendations for Population and Housing Censuses*. The Commission may wish to express its views on the activities and also adopt the revised *Principles and Recommendations*.

#### **(c) Disability measurement**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Washington Group on Disability Statistics. The report outlines the work accomplished by the Washington Group in the design of disability questions for censuses and outlines future activities, including the development of disability questions for surveys. The Commission is requested to express its views on the findings, conclusions and recommendations for future work of the Washington Group. In particular, the Washington Group is seeking the Commission's approval of its workplan for 2007.

#### **(d) Information and communication technology (ICT) statistics**

The Commission will have before it a report prepared by the Partnership on Measuring Information and Communication Technologies for Development, which

presents the list of core ICT indicators agreed upon at the 2005 global meeting on measuring the information society and recommended by the 11 member organizations of the Partnership as a basis for the collection of comparable ICT statistics internationally. The report also provides a short update of the work carried out by the Partnership and its future plans. The Commission may wish to comment on the work undertaken and the future plans of the partnership, and endorse the list of core ICT indicators presented.

#### **(e) Agricultural statistics**

The Commission will have before it a report prepared by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), providing an update on the recent developments in agricultural statistics and future challenges and plans. The report describes the basic features of the modernized FAOSTAT and its new country version CountrySTAT, the World Programme for the Census of Agriculture 2010 and work on agricultural classifications, as well as efforts to improve the coverage, quality and exchange of agricultural statistics. The Commission may wish to review the developments and express its views on the status of agricultural statistics and provide guidance on future directions and activities.

#### **(f) National accounts**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Intersecretariat Working Group on National Accounts. The report describes progress in the work completed in the updating of the System of National Accounts, 1993 (1993 SNA). The recommendations on the issues for updating will be presented to the Commission for consideration in a separate background document. The report includes the plan towards the completion of the draft 1993 SNA Rev.1. The Commission is requested to review the work on the update and express its view on the recommendations for the updating of the 1993 SNA.

#### **(g) Integrated economic statistics**

#### **(h) Environmental accounting**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Committee of Experts on Environmental-Economic Accounting. The report describes the progress of work of the Committee, in particular concerning the refinement of working relationships with other groups responsible for the development of environment, energy and related statistics. It outlines the objectives, governance and reporting structure of the London Group on Environmental Accounting during the revision process of the *System of Integrated Environmental and Economic Accounting 2003* (SEEA-2003). The report presents the draft *System of Environmental and Economic Accounting for Water* (SEEAW), as recommended by the Committee and the user community. The Commission may wish to express its views on the work of the Committee.

#### **(i) International economic and social classifications**

The Commission will have before it the report of the Secretary-General, providing updated information on the work on international classifications and focusing in particular on the implementation of the International Standard Industrial Classification of All Economic Activities (ISIC) and the Central Product Classification (CPC). The Commission may wish to comment on the outlined implementation plan.

The Commission will also have before it a report prepared by the International Labour Office (ILO) providing information on recent developments and progress in updating the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO). The report describes the status of the project and ILO plans for completion and adoption of the updated ISCO. A complete draft classification structure for the updated ISCO will be available as a background document. The Commission may wish to comment on the draft and on the ILO plans to complete the work.

#### **(j) Management issues in national statistical offices: access to microdata**

The Commission will have before it a report prepared by Australia, drawn from the work of the Task Force on Confidentiality and Microdata, constituted by the Conference of European Statisticians. The report reviews some standard ways in

which microdata are currently made available to national and international users, and outlines procedures for statistical offices to safeguard the confidentiality of individuals represented in microdata access. It also reports on the role that some international and research institutions are playing as “data depositories” for some developing country national statistical offices. The Commission may wish to express its view on the guidelines for microdata access.

**(k) Development indicators**

The Commission may wish to comment on progress made by the Expert Group and future directions of its work.

**(l) Statistical capacity-building**

This report is submitted to the Commission in accordance with its request at its thirty-seventh session to report on the implementation of the resolution adopted by the Economic and Social Council in July 2006, on strengthening statistical capacity. The report provides an overview of the work undertaken by the United Nations Statistics Division and by the Inter-Agency Expert Group on Millennium Development Goals Indicators in 2006 to support national efforts in building and strengthening national statistical capacity. The Commission may wish to comment on the report.

**(m) International Comparison Programme**

The Commission may wish to review progress and provide direction on the continuation of the Programme.
