IMF's Balance of Payments Manual

• First edition was published in 1948. Successive editions were published in 1950, 1961, 1977, and 1993.

NEEDS FOR A REVISED MANUAL

- take into account financial innovations and growth in financial services;
- clarify selected areas (e.g., scope of direct investment, services, the borderline between use of an asset and sale of an asset);
- increase emphasis on the international investment position;
- demonstrate the integration between international accounts statistics and other macroeconomic statistics
- take account of developments in international accounting standards;
- take into account specialized manuals and classification systems;
- introduce the idea of supplementary or satellite presentations;
- deal with the special issues related to currency unions and other regional monetary and economic arrangements.

AO 9. Goods and Services Account

- Should separate balances be shown for each of goods and services?
- Separating goods and services trade that occurs between related parties
- the provision of services and the provision of labor;
- Classification and coverage of services account (expansion of the modes of transport; travel; FISIM, construction services)
- Specific issues (treatment of repairs, goods for processing, merchanting, Information technology services; Insurance services)



Outcome of the First Meeting of the BOPTEG, June 22–24, 2004

- need for clear distinction between maintenance and repairs
- more coherence between the BOP and the Tourism Satellite Account (international passenger transport to be moved from transport to travel)
- computing and information services to be combined with communication
- merchanting
- reinsurance to be treated similarly to direct insurance
- goods for processing to be treated as services



Process for the Update

- Intensive review of and consultation on the methodological issues
- Continuing contact with the Intersecretariat Working Group on National Accounts (ISWGNA) and the Advisory Expert Group on National Accounts (AEG)
- BOPCOM approve a final draft of the manual in 2008
