large establishments (with 10 or more employees) are collected annually from large establishments. For small establishments, employment estimates are worked out on the basis of data collected from a household survey. Other detailed information required for the compilation of above DTS are only available every five years when a Census of Economic Activities is carried out. However, some of the indicators can be calculated for VAT registered establishments only (i.e those having an annual turnover of 2 million rupees and above).
