## Gender Atlas: use of geospatial information to produce gender statistics

## **Abstract**

At INEGI we have a mandate to develop a gender perspective in the development of statistical information. To achieve that, we rely in a large number of surveys on households, businesses and government to disseminate data disaggregated by sex.

The Gender Atlas aims to facilitate users, access to information on the conditions of women and men in the economic, demographic and social realms; to assist users with different levels of technical expertise in statistical and geospatial information.

In the Gender Atlas a set of indicators is shown in maps and graphs, along with their metadata. Work on it will evolve to eventually show time series and dynamic graphs, to visualize in user-friendly manner variables like gaps associated to inequality.
