Summary**

The third edition of the toponymic guidelines for international use by map editors and other editors includes editorial corrections to the second edition, which was presented with minor editorial corrections at the Tenth United Nations Conference, held in New York in 2012, and new information on legal, administrative and organizational matters. This edition includes information on the administrative status of all parts of the Commonwealth of the Realm of Denmark — Denmark, the Faroe Islands and Greenland.
