#### 1. INTRODUCTION

This is a report of main activities of the East Central and South-East Europe Division (ECSEED) of the United Nations Group of Experts on Geographical Names (UNGEGN) considering activities between Tenth (2012) and Eleventh (2017) United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names.

#### 2. ECSEE DIVISION COUNTRIES

In the East Central and South-East Europe Division are participating 18 countries: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Georgia, Greece, Hungary, Montenegro, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkey and Ukraine.

# 3. ECSEED CHAIRING

Slovenia took division chairing at the Tenth UN Conferences on the Standardization of Geographical Names in 2012.

At the last Division Session (Ljubljana, November 2015) was concluded that after Eleventh United Nations Conference on standardization on Geographical Names another country will take ECSEE Division chairing. For now, no country has given consent to taking over the presidency of the division.

# 4. ECSEE DIVISION SESSION

In the period 2012-2017 one meeting was held – the Twenty-first divisional session, that was held in Ljubljana, Slovenia, on 26 November 2015. The Session was attended by 21 participants from 8 ECSEE Division countries: Czech Republic, Croatia, Hungary, Poland, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia and Ukraine.

During the Session were presented all 8 national reports. The highlights of national reports and the discussion were the minority names, dialect forms and naming streets after people associated with totalitarian regimes. The discussion was also about collection and standardization of geographical names.

All papers, national reports and special presentations are published on the ECSEED web site.

## 5. ECSEE DIVISION WEB SITE
