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Names are like addresses, they can connect various data sets. On this map we can see that Mandalay has in between 500 000 and 1 million inhabitants. On the right, we see that Mandalay lies above 200 m.

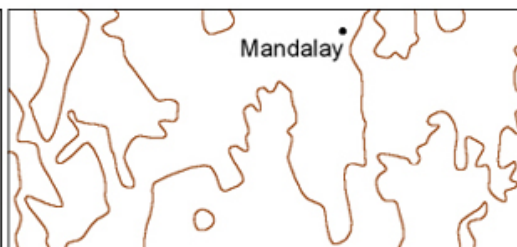
Contourline map



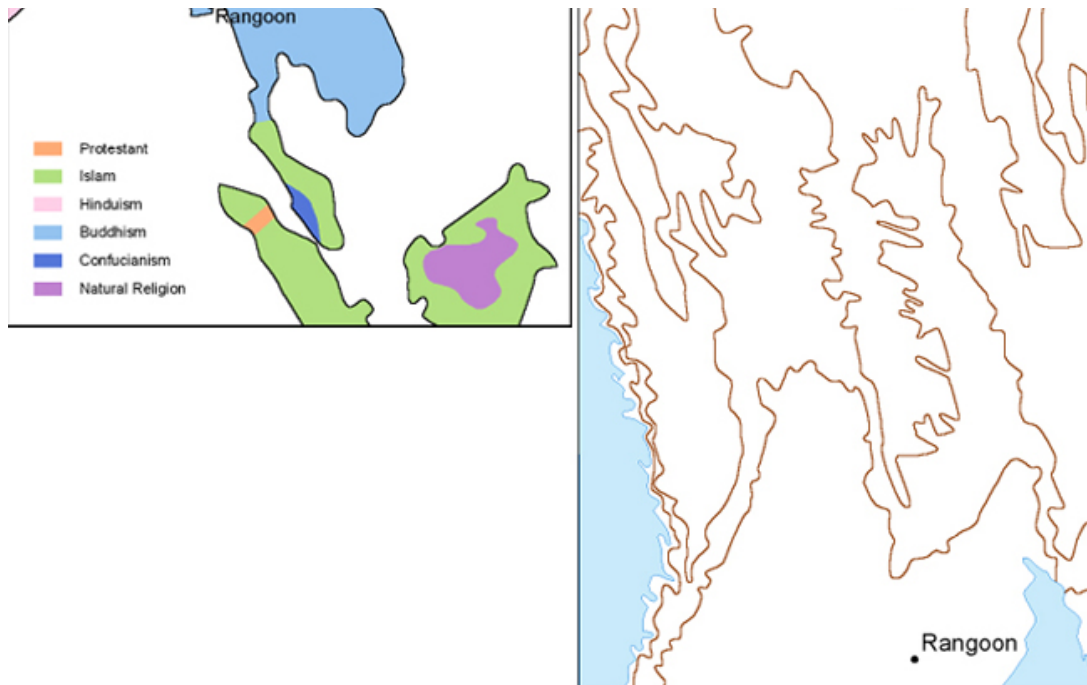
Religion map
