

Beyond Open Data: Harnessing Openness for Use and Impact

Open data is a powerful resource for informing policies, increasing transparency, and measuring progress but making data open and using it for impact requires political commitment, technical capacity, and strong partnerships. While much progress has been made to improve open data, more work needs to be done to improve data use.

Co-hosted by Statistics Poland and Open Data Watch, this event will bring together representatives from national statistical offices (NSOs) and development agencies along with open data experts to move the conversation from assessing and implementing open data in the context of official statistics to harnessing open data for policy use and impact.

Through an expert panel with a brief scene setting presentation on the global state of open data in official statistics based on the latest Open Data Inventory, the event will expand on the learnings of the UN Statistical Commission [Working Group on Open Data](#) as well as last year's side event "[The Power of Open Data: Moving from Concept to Action](#)". It will provide inputs on how the UN Statistical Commission can continue to incorporate open data into its official agenda and work program for the future.

The event will tackle enablers and barriers to ensuring open data are used for policy and impact such as privacy, ownership, and trust; politics of data and information; modernization of statistical systems, with sectoral focuses such as gender data. Covering research in these critical areas will ensure that data collected and managed by NSOs can reach their full potential and benefit society.

Specific questions to be explored in the session include:

- How are countries moving from the publication of open data to its impact and use?
- Recognizing the challenges and setbacks in open data over the years, where has the most progress been made? What are the contributing factors to that success?
- How does the UN Statistical Commission plan to continue its work on Open Data?
