SUMMARY

The paper gives a survey of the national languages of the countries of the world, their scripts and the United Nations recommendations on their romanization. As regards the names of the countries, the official United Nations usage has been followed.

The term national language is understood in the sense of the definition given in <u>Second United Nations Conference on the Standardization of Geographical Names</u> (vol. II, <u>Technical papers</u>): "National language: A language which has official status throughout a nation, including any constituent state(s), republic(s) and/or other legally defined constituent part(s)". 1/

The third column of the list shows the different scripts. It should be emphasized that also many non-Roman scripts are used for writing different languages, for example, the Arabic, Cyrillic and Devanagari scripts. In the fourth column, those recommendations of the United Nations are listed which are dealing with the romanization of the non-Roman writing systems of the respective national languages. As a rule, newer recommendations amend or supersede the older ones. It must be noted that the practical importance of the recommendations varies from country to country, and an entry in this column four does not necessarily imply, that the United Nations recommendation has been officially adopted by the country concerned.

In some cases where one language is spoken in different countries, the United Nations recommendation does not apply to all of them. Thus, for example, the recommendations on Chinese are not valid for Singapore.

The main purpose of this paper is to show at a glance what the United Nations has achieved in the field of romanization and what still has to be done.
