# Session 1 (EXPO2020): National Interest and Awareness of GVC

- Observation 1: Many user needs not met
- Observation 2: GVC are industry specific
- Observation 3: Not enough data
  - Vulnerability of national and international economy
  - Reduced quality of (macro)economic statistics





## Expected insights from GVC:

- Generation of employment, income (GDP)
- Fair labour, carbon footprint (sustainability)
- Relationship between goods and support services in GVC
- Network of all firms in GVC and governance structure

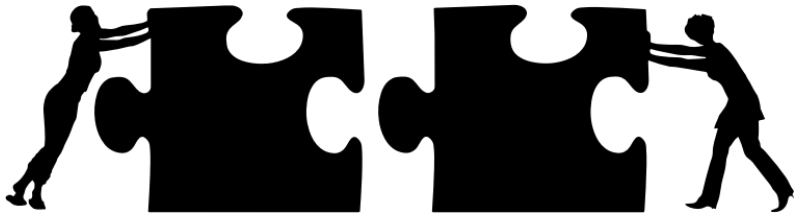
- Observation 1: Different business models
