#### **UNCTAD DATA RELEVANT TO UNCEBTS**



- ICT use by enterprises (annual collection for latest available year, developing countries and transition economies)
- ICT sector (workforce and value added related to business sector)
- Imports and exports of ICT goods (COMTRADE data), ICT services, and ICT-enabled services (3 pilot countries so far).
- Pending work under guidance of UNCTAD Working Group on Measuring E-Commerce and the Digital Economy.

## UNCTAD WORKING GROUP ON MEASURING E-COMMERCE AND THE DIGITAL ECONOMY



- Decided by the UNCTAD Intergovernmental Group of Experts (IGE) on Measuring E-Commerce and the Digital Economy
- To meet once per year, with online consultation in between

#### **OBJECTIVE OF THE UNCTAD WG-MEDE**



- Contribute to and advance cooperation on measuring ecommerce and the digital economy
- Enhance the availability, quality, comparability, usability and relevance of statistics concerning e-commerce and the digital economy, with a view to supporting policymaking, especially in developing countries
- Avoid duplication with other relevant, ongoing work

#### PARTICIPANTS IN THE UNCTAD WG-MEDE



- Governments (National Statistical Offices, Ministries of Trade, of ICT, or other competent authorities producing official statistics);
- Relevant international organizations, who shall be invited to participate (for ex. ILO, IMF, ITU, OECD, UNOSSC, UN Regional Commissions, UNSD, WCO, World Bank and WTO)
- Research networks (for ex. DIODE, LirneAsia, Research ICT Africa, NIC.br/Cetic.br and DIRSI)
- Experts from civil society, the private sector and academia may be invited, for consultative purposes, specific topics and themes.

### **OUTCOMES OF THE UNCTAD WG-MEDE**



- Recommendations for the consideration by the IGE on the topics discussed
- Other proposals to the IGE concerning the measurement of e-commerce and the digital economy, including for future topics that could be considered at future WG meetings
- Contributes to the 3 pillars of UNCTAD: research and analysis, technical assistance, consensus building
- Contribute to other initiatives on measuring ICT4D, and ecommerce and the digital economy
