








Gross Enrolment Rate - SHS










Access and use of health care during pregnancy












Teenage Pregnancy among ANC Registrant












Number of children under 1 year who have successfully received Penta3 vaccination

















Vegetation loss due to mining


Asante Akim Central








Urban extent
