## **Background – UK Health Care System**

- UK health care system
  - Department of Health and Social Care
    - Helping people to live better for longer
    - Supported by over 27 agencies and public bodies incl. National Health Service (NHS)
  - NHS is responsible for arranging the provision of health services.
- Health and Care Devolved Policy
- Health and care decentralised
  - Allowing for healthcare that is tailored to the local landscape

# Implications for Official Statistics Production


- Multiple Producers

- Publication formats
- Duplication

### To put it in context

#### Users had to navigate through;

- Around 400 official statistics publications relating to health and care, covering England alone
- Published by around 20 different government organisations
  - each with its own websites
  - > each with own processes on how users can requesting data
- Not all the producers are obvious health providers
  - Office for Standards in Education child social care
  - Department for Transport road casualties
  - Home Office drug misuse
  - MoJ Safety in custody statistics
  - MoD Casualties, PTSD statistics
- Separate smoking publications by ONS and PHE

# Impact on users:



"The health and care statistics landscape was data rich, but information poor".



"Statisticians often focus on servicing their immediate policy and operational users with insufficient effort devoted to working collaboratively to understand user needs".

Health and social care are devolved matters in the UK. Within England, the decentralised nature of the official health and care statistics system means that a number of organisations are involved in the collection of data and the publication of a range of statistical outputs. As noted by the Office for Statistical Regulation in 2016: "Statistics are published on a variety of different websites, in different formats, with no single portal available to guide researchers or the public [2". To help users find the information they need, we have introduced:

a <u>Health and Care Statistics Landscape for England</u> - this experimental output provides links to a range of official statistics produced across government

#### Successes...

#### Benefits:

- Uses R and Microsoft
   Power BI both free
- Automated using webscraping = more time to improve other parts
- Allows users to search by: keyword, theme, geography
- More visually appealing than previous version (PDF)

#### Issues:

- Free software means little service support
- Upskilling of staff to use software
- Webscraping relies on websites not changing their format – initial set up if things change can be resource-intensive
- Accessibility balancing information with ease of access


