



Definition of official statistics [from the Handbook]



Definition of Official Statistics:


Statistics produced in accordance with the Fundamental Principles of Official
Statistics by a national statistical office or by another producer of official statistics
mandated by the national government or certified by the National Statistical Office

Explanatory Notes:

- Official statistics are produced and disseminated in compliance with the respective national statistical legislation and other regulatory frameworks and are identified as such in the national statistical programmes.
- All statistics produced by a national statistical office are assumed to be official aside from those explicitly stated by the national statistical office as non-official.








Institutional Responses



Modernization of the Regulatory Framework:

- Strengthening the independence and coordination of the National Statistical System
- Establishing Integrated National Statistical Programmes
- Enhancing the leadership role of the National Chief Statistician
- Engaging with users and data communities
- Enabling access to novel data sources, including administrative records and registers, for the production of official statistics
- Expanding provisions on statistical confidentiality and data protection to novel data sources



Access to Novel Data Sources - Beyond Legislation



Provisions on establishing MoUs with administrative data providers:

- Legal basis (law, statistical programmes, contractual arrangements...)
- Description of the purpose of the data transfer/data access
- Description of data covered, including frequency and timeliness
- Quality standards and quality reports
- Technical standards
- Cooperation mechanisms for improving the adequacy of the data with statistical requirements (interoperability through consultation and partnership mechanisms)
- Focal points ...

From Authority to "Stewardship" in Statistical Legislation



National Statistics Office [NSO]

The National Chief Statistician leads the National Statistical Office

Other Producers of Official Statistics [National Statistical System]

• The Chief Statistician may issue standards and guidelines to be applied across the National Statistical System for the development, production, and dissemination of official statistics

Administrative Data and Records

- Public authorities are obliged to provide Producers of Official Statistics with administrative data in their possession, including individual data with identifiers for official statistical purposes
- Administrative data providers shall inform and consult the National Chief Statistician when they plan to develop a new administrative data collection or make a major revision to an existing data set.

Private and Public Secondary Data Sources

 The Chief Statistician may promote the use of standards, terminology, classifications, and technology applied in official statistics among public and private data providers and operators (data ecosystem)

Interoperability of Normative Frameworks



National Data Ecosystem

- Privacy and Data Protection Act
 Governs personal data collected, processed and/or shared by public and private operators
- Public Information Access Act
 Governs the procedure which ensures free access to and right to reuse information held by public authorities
- Archiving Act
 Rules the procedure for archiving data of national interest
- Code of Ethics



National Statistical System

- National Statistical Normative Framework:
- In the case of conflicting legislation, the provisions of this Act, as well as any subsidiary legislation, shall take precedence. Any other legislation referencing official statistics, as outlined in Section 1, must be progressively amended to conform with this Act.
- On behalf of the National Statistical System, the National Chief Statistician must be informed and consulted in a timely manner on any initiative aimed at creating a new legal basis or modifying existing legislation that may impact the development, production, and dissemination of official statistics..
