Monitoring of SDG in the CIS region: current status and development

The Interstate Statistical Committee of the CIS (CIS-Stat) develops the activity on SDGs indicators since 2016.

- a special survey of the opinions of CIS countries on the global list of SDGs indicators was conducted
- the list of indicators for the CIS region was formed basing on the results of the survey
- a section on the SDGs "Statistics for SDGs: the CIS region" was created on the CIS-Stat website
- a statistical abstract on SDGs was prepared and sent to the national statistical services (NSS) for comments and suggestions





The purpose of the survey is the question of the availability of methodology and statistical information in the countries for monitoring progress of implementation of SDG.

As a result:

- "gaps" in statistical data and in methodology for global list of indicators were identified

- there are significant problems with the levels of data disaggregation
- the survey is one of the tools for assessing countries' readiness to report on SDG indicators

The list of indicators for the CIS region contains 111 indicators from the global list of SDG indicators .

The list is based on principle of relevance of global indicators for the CIS countries.

About a third part of the list of 111 relevant indicators for the CIS countries requires additional clarification of the wording or the methodology for calculating them is not available in the countries.

The Interstate Statistical Committee of the CIS asks the Inter-Agency Expert Group on SDG and international organizations dealing with relevant issues within the framework on the list of global indicators to solve the methodological problems of SDGs indicators, paying attention to problems identified in the work, conducted by the national statistical services of the CIS countries.





The section "Statistics for SDGs: CIS region" on the CIS-Stat website is an information platform on SDGs.

- This Russian-language informational resource is of interest for a wide range of users.
- The interest in the creation of such a platform was expressed by countries and was confirmed at the meeting of experts on statistics for SDGs (Geneva, April 10-12, 2017).

Project of statistical abstract on SDG

Abstract bases on the list of SDG indicators for the CIS region.

The sources of information for abstract

- the official data of the CIS national statistical services in the framework of the agreement on interstate exchange of statistical information
- data from official sites of national statistical services
- data from sites of international organizations





Project of statistical abstract "Monitoring of SDG indicators in the CIS region" includes 14 of 17 Sustainable Development Goals and 40 indicators from Global List of SDG indicators.

At the same time in abstract were used additional indicators that were not included in the Global List but they can be used for monitoring the achievement of SDG in the CIS region.

In March 2018 the project of statistical abstract was sent to the national statistical services for comments and suggestions.

The abstract is being produced by the CIS-Stat jointly with NSS. It is one of the components of the development of national data platforms on SDG.
