

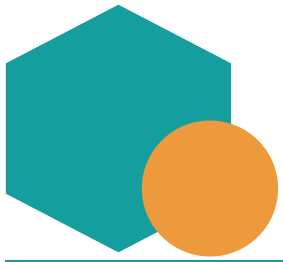

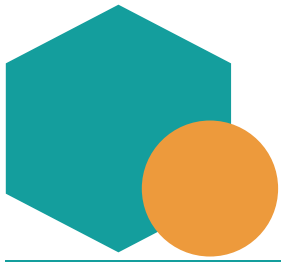

Target 17.18

By 2020, **enhance** capacity-building support to developing countries, including for least developed countries and small island developing States, to increase **significantly** the availability of high-quality, timely and reliable data **disaggregated** by income, gender, age, race, ethnicity, migratory status, disability, geographic location and other characteristics relevant in national contexts

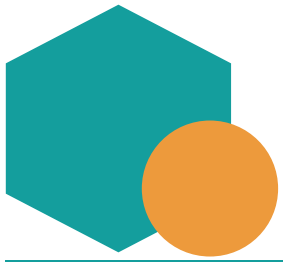


3 indicators

17.18.1 (Tier III) Proportion of sustainable development indicators produced at the national level with full disaggregation when relevant to the target, in accordance with the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics

17.18.2 (Tier II) Number of countries that have national statistical legislation that complies with the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics

17.18.3 (Tier I) Number of countries with a national statistical plan that is fully funded and under implementation, by source of funding



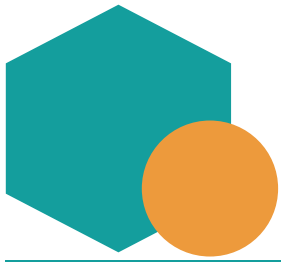
Assumptions

- The two available indicators are equally important → the target is met only if both are improved by a large margin
- Target measured by the percentage increase in the number of countries
- The base year against which the 2020 value will be compared is the year 2015
- Only countries with at least 2 entries point will be considered for the comparison during the period, with necessarily a data point available for 2020.



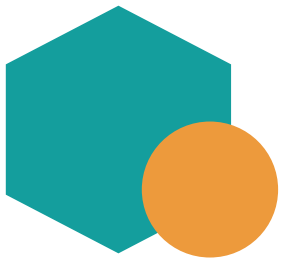
Criteria for approach

- Simplicity
- Transparency
- Fairness
- Sustainability



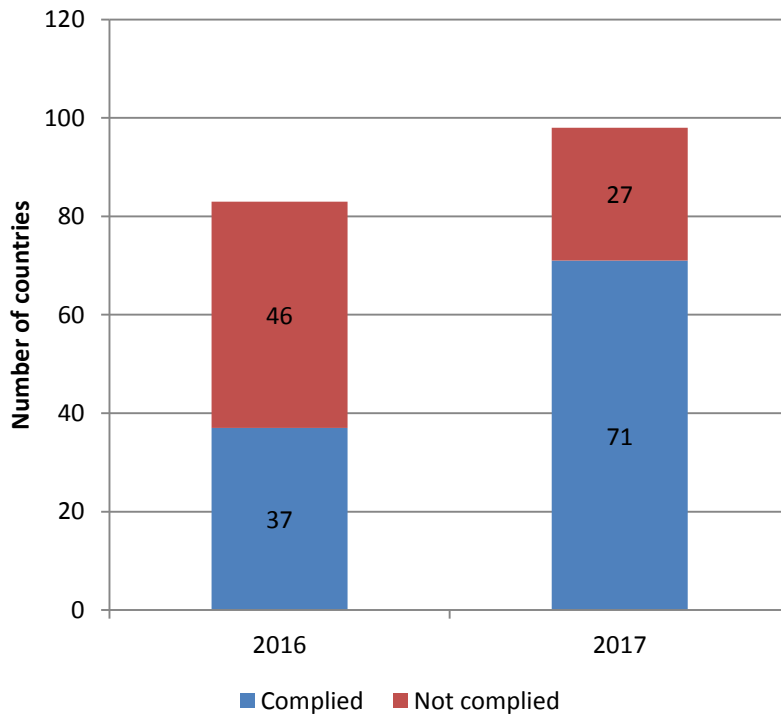
Proposal

1. If both indicators are improved by at least X% by 2020, **the target is met.**
2. If not, and both indicators are improved more than Y% by 2020, **the target is not met but the situation is significantly improved.**
3. If none of the above, and both indicators are improved by more than 0% by 2020, **the target is not met but the situation is slightly improved.**
4. If none of the above, one indicator remains the same and the other improved by more than 0% by 2020, **the target is not met and the situation is partially stagnant.**



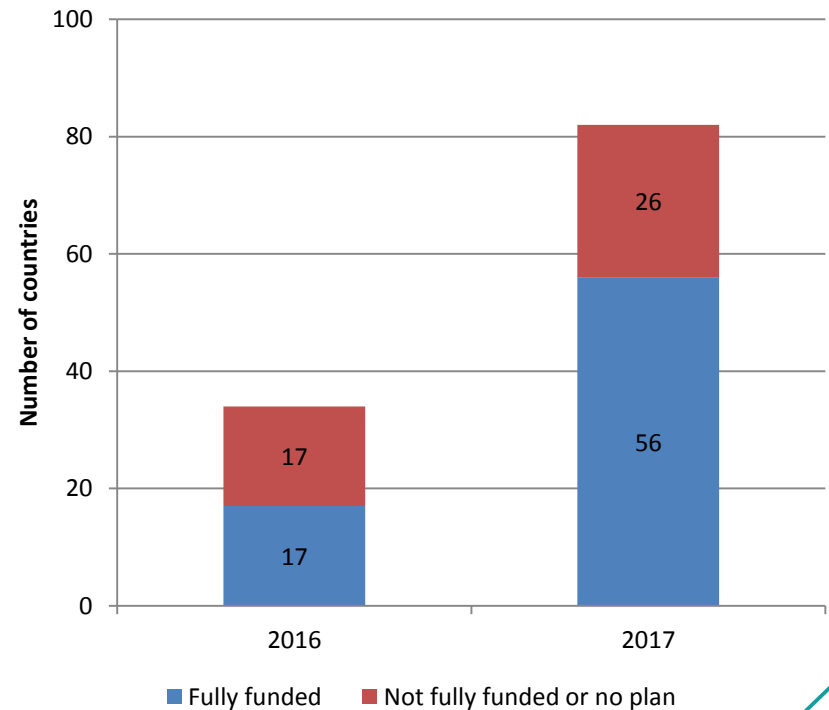
Some trends

17.18.3 Number of countries with a national statistical plan that is fully funded and under implementation, by source of funding

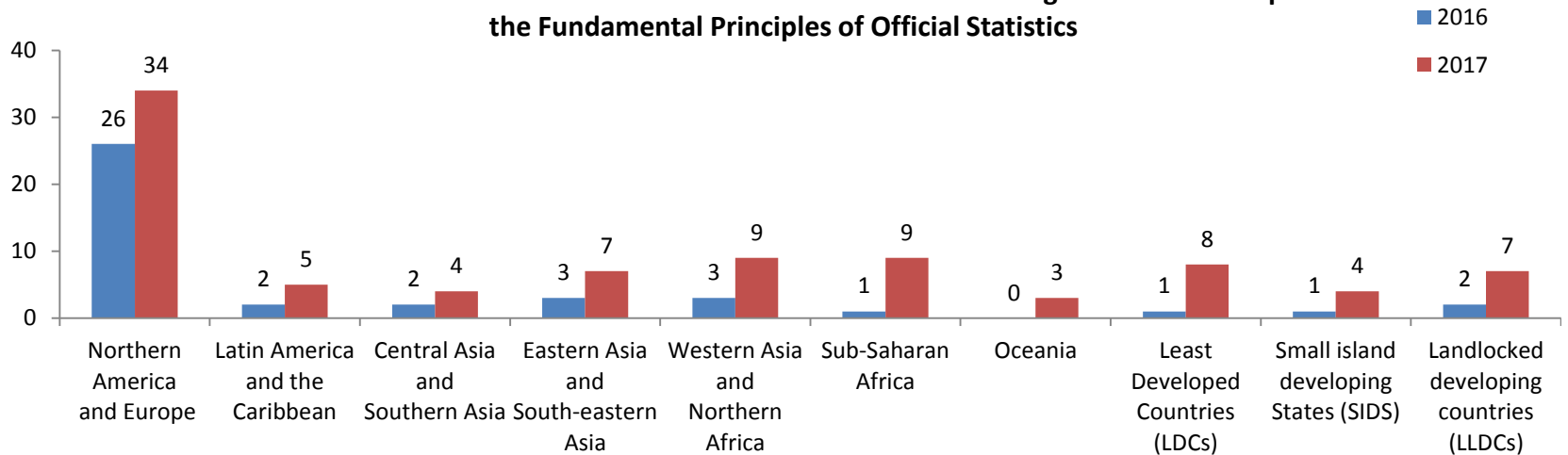


* N = 34 in 2016, N = 81 in 2017

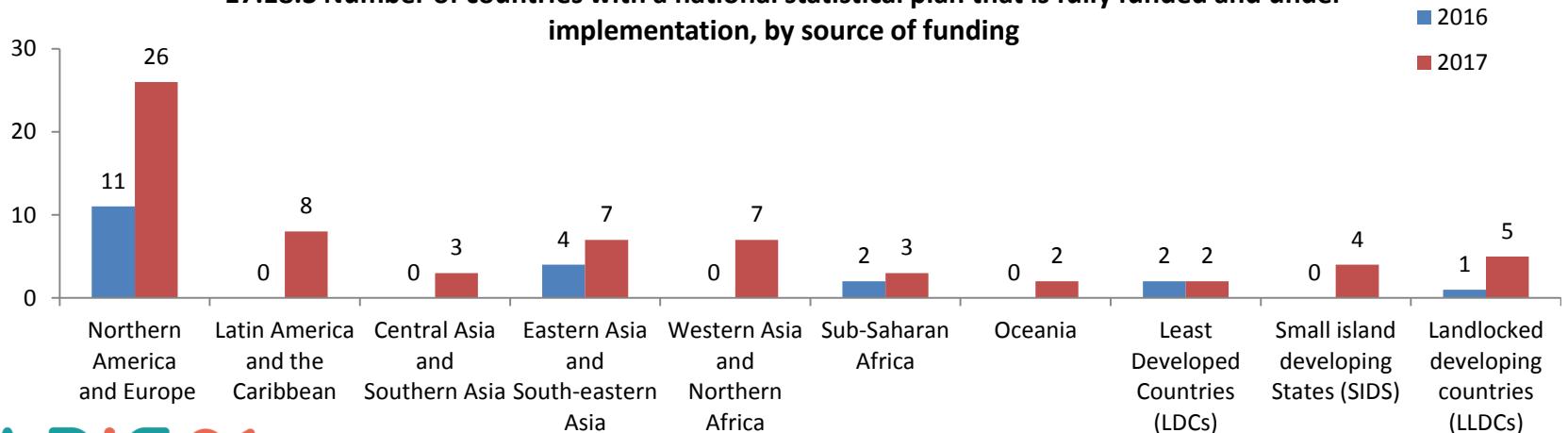


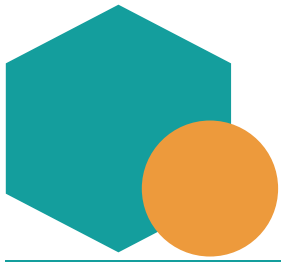
Trend by region

Indicator 17.18.2 Number of countries that have national statistical legislation that complies with the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics



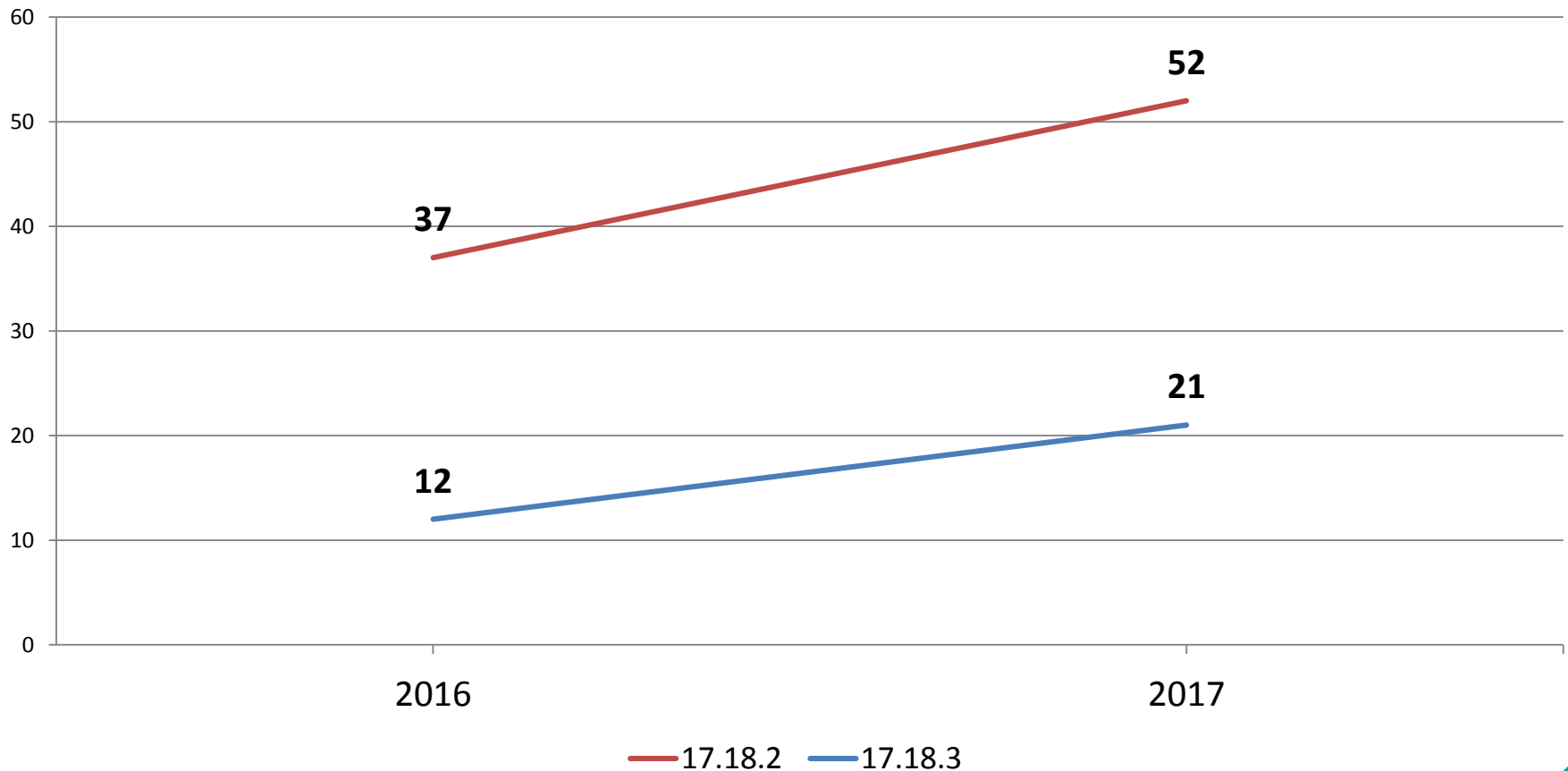
17.18.3 Number of countries with a national statistical plan that is fully funded and under implementation, by source of funding





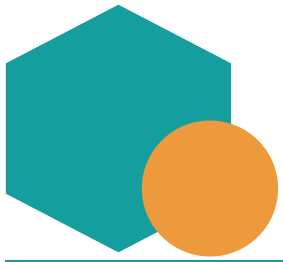
Progress toward targets
