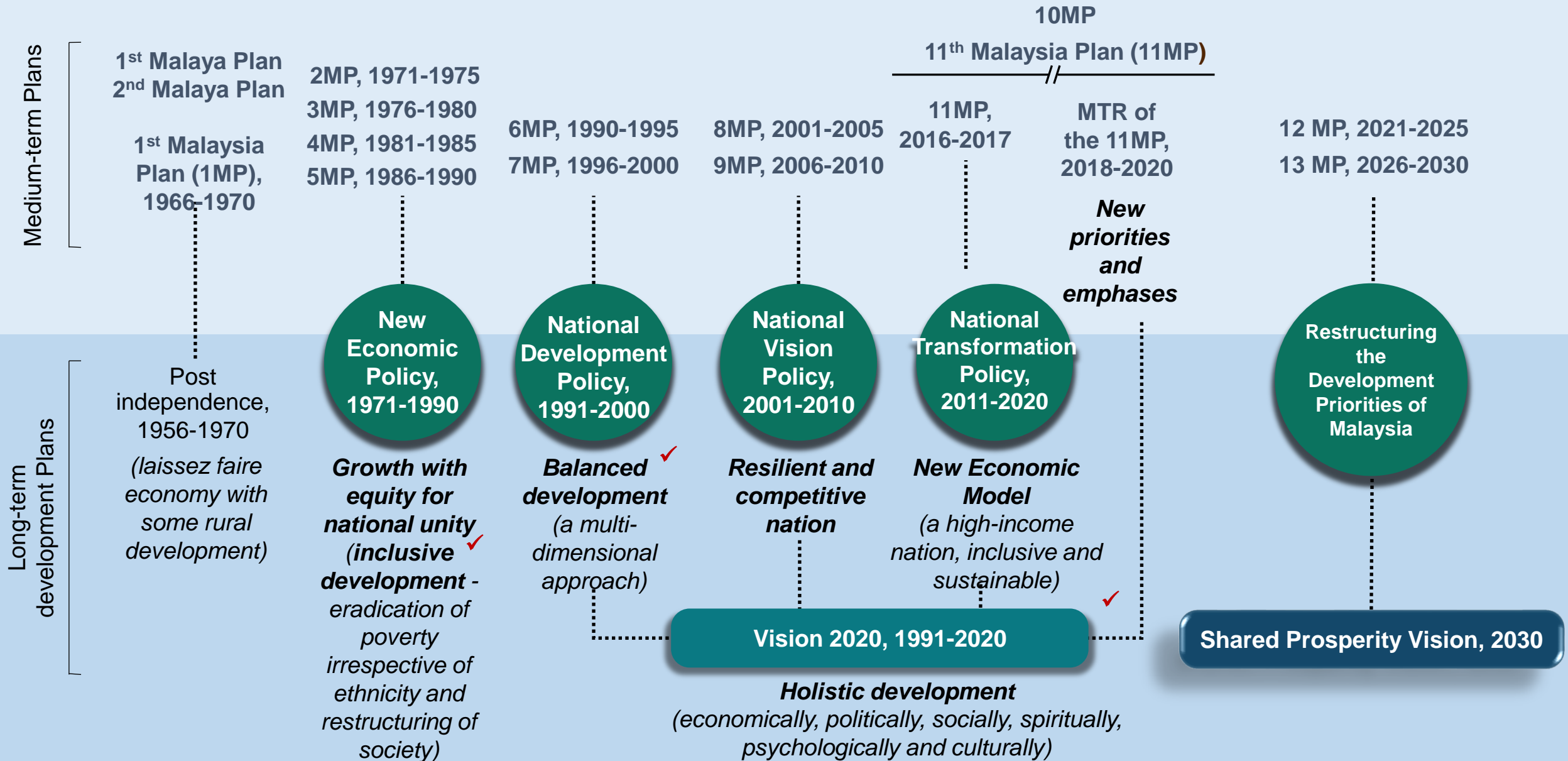

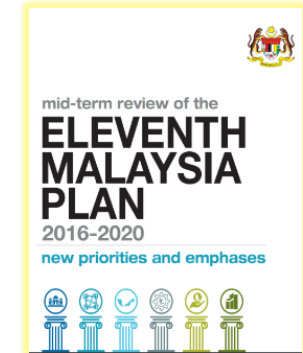
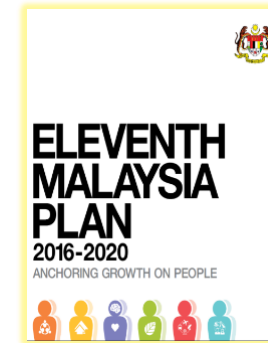

December 2018: Publication of the Initial Assessment of The Sustainable Development Goals Indicators for Malaysia 2018 by DOSM

This report presents findings of the initial assessment of the SDGs indicators to be used by the government agencies, private sectors, academicians and individuals for SDGs implementation.

2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

193 Member States adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

March 2019: Launched National SDG Progress Monitoring System (DOSM) in Putrajaya

July 2019: High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development, New York, USA
YBTM MEA represented Malaysia.

September 2019: SDG Summit 2019, New York, USA

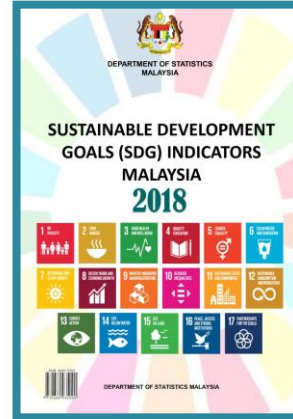

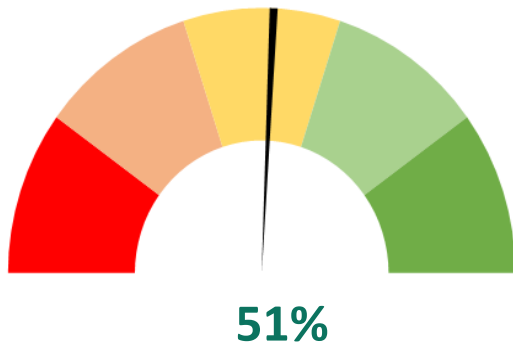

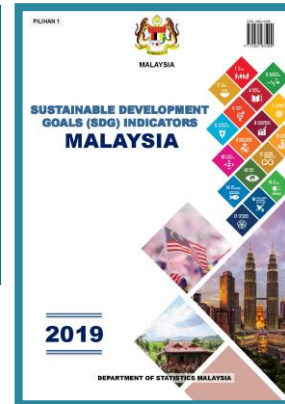

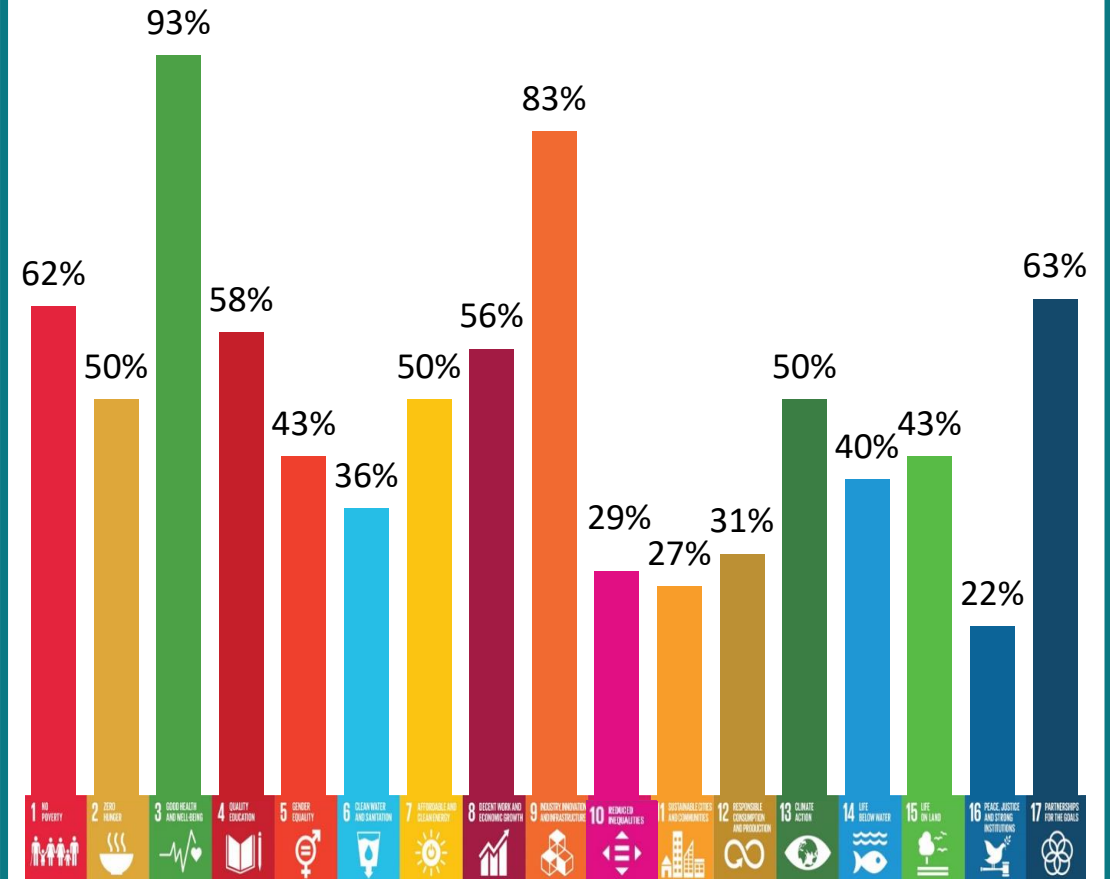

About Malaysia SDG Cities Roadmap

The Malaysia SDG Cities recognizes that cities and communities are crucial in determining its own set of priorities and decides on the means of implementation to ensure that the SDG Goals and targets are met.

The framework is set to encourage a bottom up approach in developing local action plans that will accelerate the SDGs achievements for Malaysia where the 17 SDGs and its 169 targets of the 2030 Sustainable Agenda must be achieved.

Localizing the global goals at cities and urban areas is important for an urban nation like Malaysia and the Malaysia SDG Cities will ensure that vertical integration between national and state policies at all levels are aligned to the SDGs by realizing the aspirations and ensuring of its effective implementation locally.
