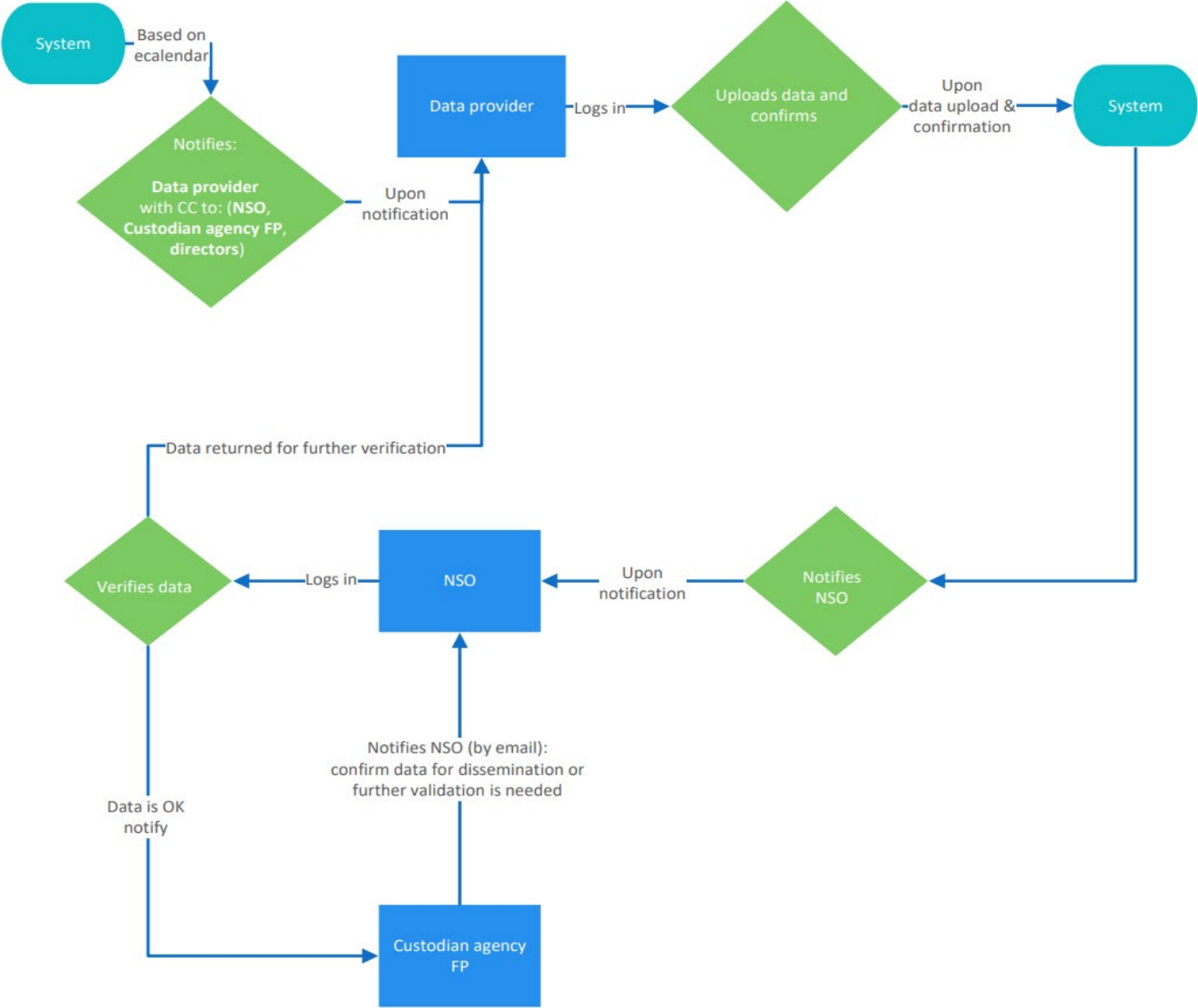

- Once the data is reported, the NSO coordinator will receive a notification email that the data has been reported by the ministry coordinator.
- NSO coordinator's role is to verify the data. Once the data is verified, he/she must login into the system to certify it if complete. Otherwise, data will be returned to the ministry coordinator.
