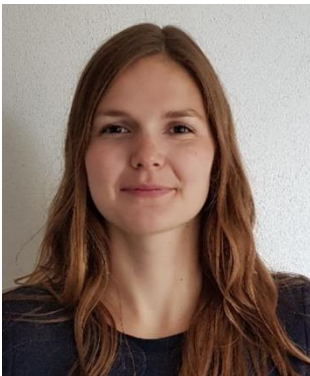




**Denise Kronemberger** is a Geographer and a Ph.D in Geosciences with 22 years of progressive experience working in the Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE), coordinating teams in the production of sustainable development indicators. She was a member of the Environmental Indicators Group from Latin American and Caribbean Initiative for Sustainable Development. Also she was a member of the UN Expert Group of Environmental Statistics (EGES/UNSD).

As a professor at the National School of Statistical Sciences (ENCE/IBGE), she wrote a book on sustainable local development, launched during the Rio + 20 Conference. Denise has 27 years of experience in teaching, having worked with different audiences, from elementary school, through high school and college (undergraduate and graduate courses).

Nowadays, she is the Head of Institutional Relations in the Presidency of IBGE. She has been managing the production of Brazilian SDG Indicators. Her work also includes activities of the National Commission for the SDGs, representing IBGE, as a technical advisory body. Denise is currently Co-Chair (along with Canada) of the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on the SDG Indicators (IAEG-SDGs). She has also joined in the Statistical Coordination Group for the 2030 Agenda in Latin America and the Caribbean.



**Bo Hoogerwerf** is an SDG and wellbeing expert for Statistics Netherlands. She has a background in transition studies, focusing on a transition to a sustainable society. Her work at Statistics Netherlands focuses on continuing the development for a monitoring system regarding wellbeing and the SDGs. She is also responsible for our sub-national monitoring, the development of monitoring the SDGs for the Caribbean Netherlands and the coordination of the development regarding more of the global indicators for the European part of the Netherlands. As the national SDG focal point, she is also responsible for coordinating SDG monitoring with the ministries and the custodian agencies.



**Steve MacFeely** is the Director of Data and Analytics at the World Health Organization, based in Geneva, Switzerland and Adjunct Professor at the Department of Economics at University College Cork in Ireland. He is co-chair of the Committee of the Chief Statisticians of the UN System (CCS-UN) and of the Committee for the Coordination of Statistical Activities (CCSA), chairs the Advisory Boards of the Statistical Journal of the IAOS, and of the International Statistical Literacy Project (ISLP), and the UN Productive Capacity Index Technical Advisory Board. Before joining WHO, Steve was Chief Statistician at UNCTAD. Prior to joining the UN, he was the Deputy Director-General at the Central Statistics Office (CSO) in Ireland.



Mary Smyth is a statistician in the Central Statistics Office, Ireland, with responsibility for managing and reporting on the UN SDG Indicators data for Ireland. Her work involves participation in a number of SDG National, International and UN working groups, including membership of the UNECE Steering Group on SDG Statistics which developed the UNECE Road Map on Statistics for SDGs (2nd edition). Mary is currently Co-Chair (along with Colombia) of the IAEG-SDG Working Group on Geospatial Information (UN-WGGI). Having gained expertise on CSO Surveys and big data projects, she began working in the newly established CSO SDG Division in 2018. Mary has an honours degree in both Mathematics and Geography, and a Ph.D in Applied Geophysics.
