



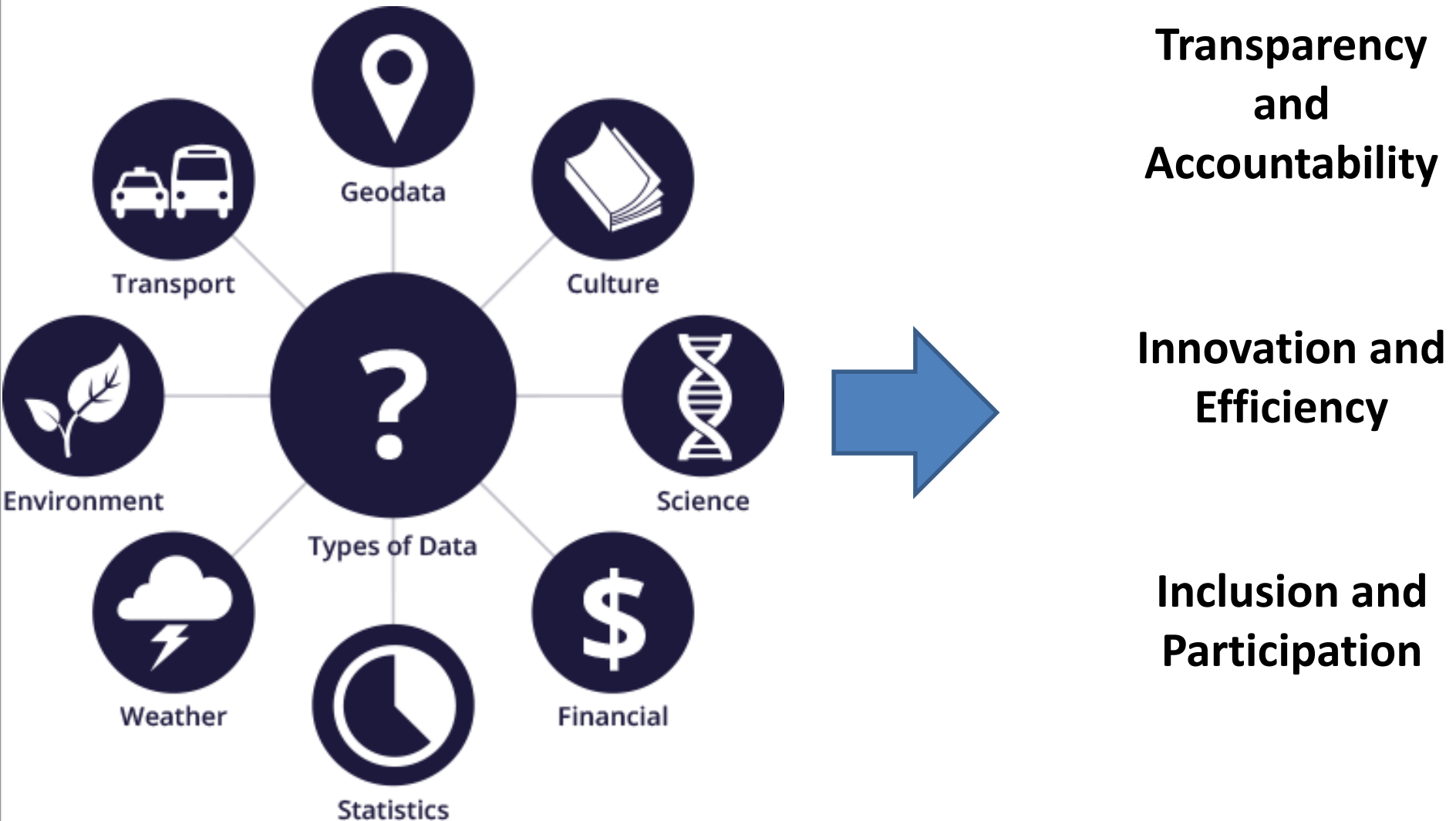

Improving Everyday Lives

Jamaica: HarvestAPI uses open data to help farmers be more profitable.

India: TransparentChennai maps public toilets to improve the accessibility of basic sanitation.

Solving Public Problems in New Ways

Uruguay: The healthcare application A Tu Servicio makes it easy for people to compare wait times and services at publically funded clinics.

Kosovo: Young leaders used open data to clean up their city by mapping illegal dumping sites.

Making Governments Better

Indonesia: The City of Jakarta is using open data to enhance smart city services and make public spending more transparent.

Burkina Faso: By sharing real-time open election data in the latest election, the national government enhanced trust in the political process.

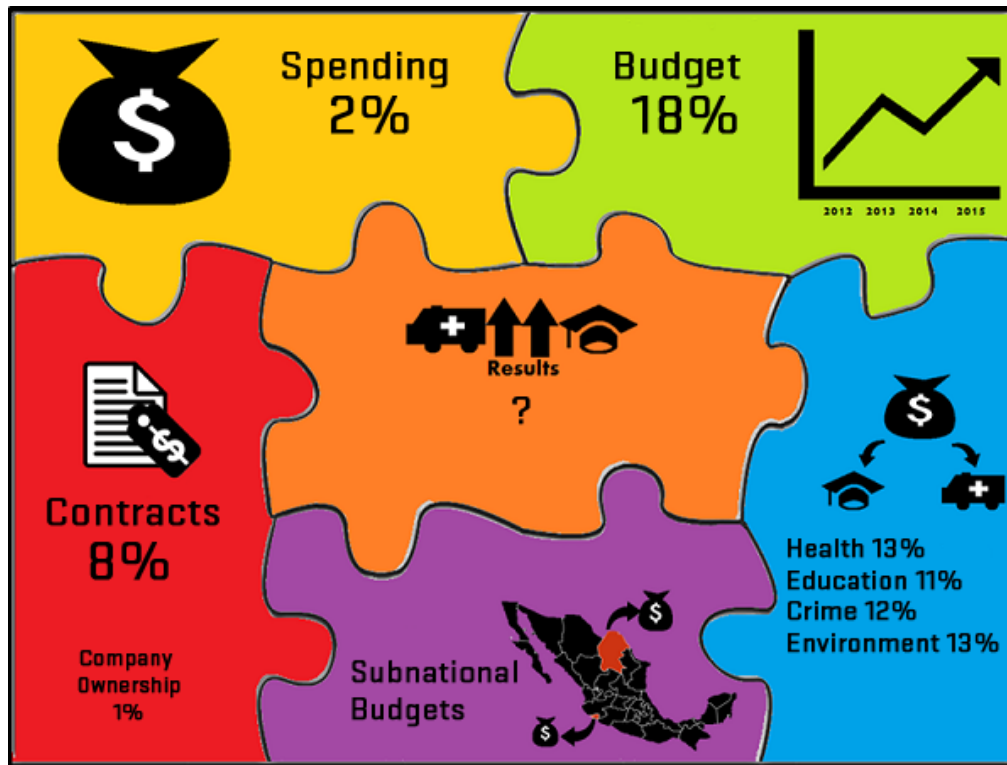
