What are the main challenges for national SDG monitoring?

- Broad and complex agenda with many new areas
- Limited resources of national statistical systems
- Limited technical capacity
- Data disaggregation

→ Large data gaps, poor data quality, lack of timely data and unavailability of disaggregated data are among the major challenges.



Lessons Learned from MDGs

- Integrate the agenda into national development plan: national ownership and political support
- Participation of all governmental agencies and crosssectoral and cross-ministerial engagement:
 - Establishment of coordination bodies and central repository of data at the national level
 - Increased coordination among all members of NSS
- Increased national and international resources and investment
- Prioritization and localization



... and some recommendations:

- An integrated statistical system: need transformation of NSOs and NSSs
- Use of international standards
- "Big data" and new technology
- Integration of Geospatial information
- New partnerships: Private sector, civil society, academia and other organizations



Support at international level

- The High-level Group for Partnership, Coordination and Capacity-Building for statistics for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (HLG)
- A joint sub-group composed of members of both the HLG and the Inter-Agency and Expert Group on SDG indicators (IAEG-SDGs), with the purpose of developing a plan to address the immediate priorities for the implementation of the global SDG indicators.



Global Action Plan developed by the HLG

Six Strategic areas:

- 1. Improving coordination and strengthening strategic leadership on data for sustainable development
- 2. Promoting innovation and modernization of national statistical systems
- 3. Strengthening basic statistical activities and programmes
- 4. Ensuring proper dissemination and use of sustainable development data
- 5. Establishing multi-stakeholder partnerships for sustainable development data
- 6. Promoting the Mobilization resources and coordinate efforts for statistical capacity building



Support from the UN system

- A joint \$10 Million Programme on Statistics and Data under the 10th Tranche of the Development Account
- Additional development account projects and training projects carried out by UNSD
- SDG Country Reporting Guidelines
