Discussed in the Open-ended intergovernmental expert working group on indicators and terminology relating to disaster risk reduction (OIEWG) where national representatives and observer agencies were present.

What is the involvement of or how do you plan to involve National Statistical Systems in the development of the methodology?

This indicator is same as the global indicator E-2 of the Sendai Framework Monitor. After OIEWG sessions in developing the Technical Guidance of Indicators for the Sendai Framework Target A-G, the draft was widely circulated for consultation and discussed at the Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction in May 2017 where national representatives, UN and other international agencies, as well as any other stakeholders participated.

Please briefly describe the process of developing the methodology for the indicator

An initial draft of the Technical Guidance was deliberated during OIEWG sessions then widely consulted with Member States and other stakeholders in April-June. UNISDR conducted the Sendai Framework Data Readiness Review to find out data availability and capacity gaps, and these were discussed the Technical Guidance and outcomes of the Review in the Global Platform in May 2017. Afterwards integrating all feedback and refining, the updated Technical Guidance will be publicly available in October and further developed through the year.

Please indicate new international standards that will need to be proposed and approved by an intergovernmental process (such as UNSC) for this methodology.

Since it has already involved intergovernmental process, additional process will not be necessary.
