List of Czech Exonyms

The aim of the gazetteer List of Czech Exonyms is to codify the Czech forms of foreign

geographical names. For purpose of the list, the exonyms have been collected from various kinds

of professional and popular literature where they occur. The idea was to present the

contemporary stage of their usage, that is why the forms of some exonyms have been changed in

comparison to forms that were standardized in former lists. The integral parts of the publication

are the list of selected literature related to exonyms and map appendices.

The general conception of the gazetteer includes defining exonyms, the principles of the

choice of names and the structure of the entries. The List of Czech Exonyms has been prepared

by the collective of authors, consisting of the members of the Commission on Geographical

Names of the Czech Office for Surveying, Mapping and Cadastre: Tomáš Beránek – the leader

of the collective of authors, Pavel Bohác, Milan V. Drápela, Vladimír Lišcák and Rudolf

Šrámek. As experts, linguist Milan Harvalík and historian Robert Šimunek have been invited to

collaborate.

Whilst the standardized forms of exonyms, which are recommended to use, are printed in

boll. In contrast those forms of exonyms that are not standardized by the Commission on

Geographical Names of the Czech Office for Surveying, Mapping and Cadastre are not marked

in bold. Less frequently or seldom used and regional exonyms, which are neither standardized,

are printed in *italics*, e.g. *Bavory* besides **Bavorsko**.

The list contains ca. 2 500 exonyms most of them have been standardized. Czech

exonyms that occur rare in spoken or written language have been selected.

The List of Czech Exonyms is to be published in summer 2006. It has been written in

Czech nevertheless it will be accompanied by the English commentary. As the sample, the

first page of the List of Czech Exonyms is attached to this report as Supplement.
