Dear Collegues,

I am in receipt of the draft agenda of the Group of Experts firth session. Having studied in addition recommendations of the London Conference on Standardization of Geographical Names and the Report of the fourth session of our group, I should like to draw your attention to the fact that, by my opinion, the agenda you suggested requires as to its points some addition and specification.

You can judge my corrections by my version of the provisional agenda which I enclose herewith. Not delaying over the points which, as I think, do not need explanatory remarks I intend to give grounds for the other, more essential, points.

During these meetings members of working groups and other experts who will like to join them will be able to meet at the first time after the London conference, to discuss problems in their charge, and prepare co-ordinated reports which can later be submitted'by chairmen (co-ordinators) to the consideration of all the participants.

The previous sessions showed that if the meetings of working groups were conducted above the approved agenda of the session, i.e. in the morning or in the evening before or after plenary meetings, they did not obtain desirable results. Difficulties redouble when one and the seme person is at the same time a member of different working groups.

Therefore. I suggest that the meetings of working groups be included in the agenda as a separate item and no less than a day or even two full working days of the forthcoming session be planned for that purpose. That will permit to prepare more interesting and specific reports which will take less time to discuss them at the plenary meeting of the session. Further I suggest the subdivision of point 5 of the preliminary agenda into subitems to which different recommendations of the London conference correspond (to (a)-- Recommendation 24, (b) - Recommendation 25, (c) $\sqrt{(d)}$ (d) -- Recommendation 21). These recommendations contain instructions for our group.

Proposing further to exclude from point 8 the guestion about the acceptability of romanization systems, I think that this problem should receive sufficient consideration during discussing the report of the working group on romanization. As to the reduction of exonyms and application of discritics they, as I think, need a different discussion.

My version of the agenda of the forthcoming session, as you can see, retains all its previous points and at the same time permits to conduct the discussion with more order. completeness, and less waste of time.
