

























## Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration

Objective 1: Collect and utilize accurate and disaggregated data as a basis for evidence-based policies




Raised the profile and importance of data and statistics

Put significant pressure on countries' statistical capacity to fulfil new migration data requirements




#### What do we know about international migrants?

#### 2010 Round of Pop. Censuses




