Repository of SBR Maturity Mode (MM) Toolkit

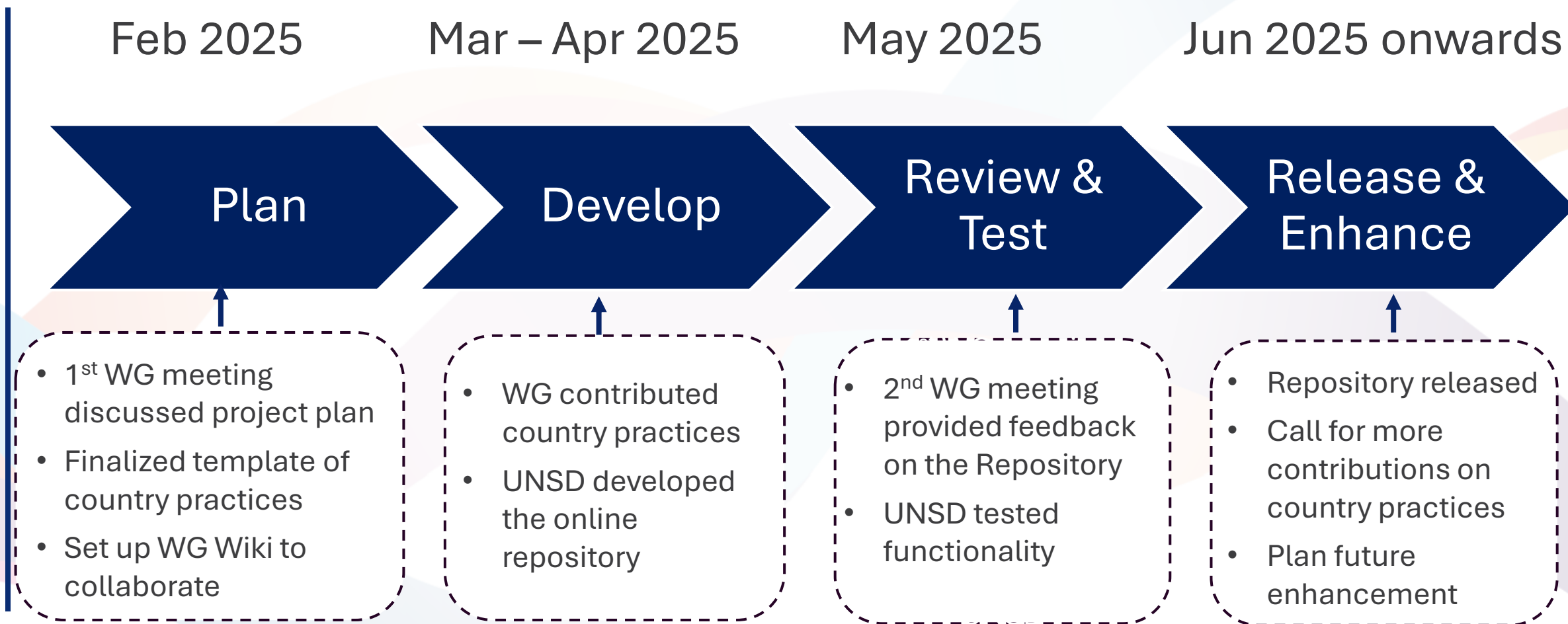
- To provide country practices of the SBR management by the dimension of SBR Maturity Model (MM)
