

- PAS II: EU-funded programme (2022–2026) supporting statistical harmonisation
- Focus: External trade, labour market, informal economy, business register and digital tools
- Collaboration with NSOs, RECs, UNECA, AfDB, ILO, Eurostat




#### TRADE STATISTICS: A PAN-AFRICAN FRAMEWORK



#### **Continental Coherence in Trade Statistics**

- Data Transmission Protocol (DTP) adopted by over 40 countries
- Guidelines on Informal Cross-Border Trade (ICBT)
- Guidelines on Trade Indices (UVI, XPI, MPI)
- Harmonised templates for metadata and reporting





#### MIRROR AND RECONCILIATION EXERCISES



#### **Reducing Trade Data Gaps and Asymmetries**

- Bilateral mirror exercises launched under STATAFRIC coordination
- Focus on key trade corridors (e.g., Ethiopia–Djbouti, DRC-Zambia, etc.)
- Identification of asymmetries, causes, and corrective actions
- Documentation and harmonisation of IMTS practices



#### **AFRICAN TRADE STATISTICS YEARBOOK**



#### **Towards a Harmonised African Trade Yearbook**

- ATSY 2024: First African Trade Statistics Yearbook under STATAFRIC leadership
- Includes metadata control and regional consistency checks
- Supports AfCFTA monitoring and regional integration policies
- Support to IGAD ("Facts & Figures" Yearbook (harmonised indicators)
- Drafting of "Key Stats" regional statistical snapshot
- Design and implementation of a centralised trade statistics database



#### ITSS E-LEARNING MODULE



#### ITSS Training: Accessible, Certified, Aligned with MSITS

- Launch of e-learning on International Trade in Services Statistics (ITSS)
  - Based on MSITS 2010
  - Open to NSOs, Central Banks, Ministries, Analysts
- Hosted on the AU e-learning platform (July–Sept. 2025)
- Fully self-paced, with interactive modules and certification
- Supports sustainable capacity building across Africa





#### INTEGRATED LABOUR AND TRADE STATISTICS



- Joint work under STG-ES (External Sector) and STG-EIE (Labour & Informality)
- Minimum list of indicators for employment and informal economy
- Use of existing sources: censuses, household surveys, admin data
- Shared metadata frameworks and cross-domain coherence



#### GLOBAL STATISTICAL REVISIONS



- Africa's Voice in the Revisions of IMTS and MSITS
- Technical inputs to the revision of IMTS and MSITS manuals
- Focus areas:
  - Informal cross-border trade
  - Data from non-traditional sources
  - Digital services and e-commerce
- Contributions from STG-ES and STG-EIE experts
- Coordinated through STATAFRIC and PAS II

#### **Next Steps for Coherence and Integration**

- Finalisation and dissemination of:
  - ICBT Guidelines
  - Trade Indices Guidelines
- Expansion of the Data Transmission Protocol to all AU Member States
- Scale-up of ITSS e-learning and new modules (e.g., ICBT, trade metadata)
- Interlinkages: trade ↔ labour ↔ enterprise statistics
- Regional support: IGAD, ECCAS, ECOWAS

#### STRENGTHENING STATISTICAL BUSINESS REGISTERS ACROSS AFRICA



- STATAFRIC, in partnership with ECOBUSAF (one of the grant from PAS II program)
  and with the support of international partners launched a continental effort to enhance
  the capacity of African National Statistics Offices (NSOs) in establishing and
  managing Statistical Business Registers (SBRs).
- Participating countries include Senegal, Mauritius, Namibia, and more recently Nigeria.
- Joint capacity-building activities include technical missions, study visits (e.g., to SSB in Norway and Mauritius), and online trainings.
- These efforts contribute directly to Agenda 2063 and the Second Strategy for the Harmonization of Statistics in Africa (SHaSA 2).







- **Joint Study Visits were organized**: Norway (May 2024), Mauritius (Nov 2024) with participation from Senegal, Namibia, and Mauritius NSOs to explore administrative data use, SBR architecture, informal sector coverage, and the **Statbus platform.**
- Online Training (Nov 2024): 25 statisticians from 13 AU countries trained on business demography statistics and administrative data integration.
- Joint capacity-building activities **include technical missions**, **study visits** and online trainings.
- New partnership with Nigeria launched in 2024 with a mapping mission and planned technical missions for 2025 to support SBR harmonization and Statbus test implementation.



#### FROM STRATEGY TO NATIONAL ACTION



- Several countries (Benin, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Cameroon, Tunisia, ..) showcased national SBRs, with varying progress and tools (From Excel-based systems, to more customized SBR dedicated tools).
- Significant efforts toward linking administrative sources (tax, social security, customs) to ensure comprehensive, regularly updated business registers.
- Increased emphasis **on profiling large enterprises**, use of ISIC Rev.4 and preparation for Rev.5, **geocoding**, **and technological upgrades** (machine learning for activity coding,..).
- STATAFRIC actively supports technical guidance and coordinates across PAOs and RECs to harmonize methodologies and monitoring tools, with the support of PAS II program.



#### MAJOR RECOMMENDATIONS FROM DOUALA SBR WORKSHOP



- STATAFRIC organized a workshop on Statistical Business Registers in Douala (March 2024) with representatives from 15 AU Member States, 5 Regional Economic Communities, and several Pan-African and international organizations
- Major Recommendations from the meeting:
  - Asked PAOs and partners to provide technical and financial assistance, share software solutions (such as StatBus), and coordinate actions on SBR.
  - Encouraged MS to establish dedicated SBR departments in NSOs, improve IT infrastructure, conduct regular economic censuses
- Strategic Coordination: A technical SBR group was created under SHaSA II to sustain collaboration and guide implementation across the continent.
