Objective of the template

The template has two main objectives:

- To know the status of country initiatives and practices to integrate a gender perspective in business and trade statistics; and
- To compile experiences for being included in a specific domain on integrating gender in business and trade statistics within the UNCEBTS Global Online Repository

This template provides a standardized format, consistent with other activities within the UNCEBTS

Third section is designed to collect experiences related to mainstreaming gender in business and trade statistics

- A **Content** section includes a short description of the statistical products developed, emphasizing their scope, periodicity, breakdown, dissemination practices, and timeliness, among other topics. Additionally, describe the activities undertaken according to the stage of statistical production, such as specifying user needs for data, data collection and linkage, analysis, dissemination, and communication. Also, mention the data sources used (Census, Survey, Administrative, Sociodemographic registers, Linked-Employer-Employee Database, or other data sources), techniques used, classifications, statistical units (Enterprise Groups, Enterprises, Kind of activity Units, Local units, Establishments) and/or other units (such as the use of legal form for natural persons and legal persons) used to perform the linkage, as well as other technical considerations.
