Why new data sources?

- New phenomena, new data needed
- Digitalization: our daily activities generate all kind of new data
- Reduce / monitor the administrative burden
 - Replace existing survey data
 - Prevent increase of burden by not asking new questions
- We are no longer a statistics monopolist
 - Use other sources to speed up process
- We only get what we ask, we only know what we get
- But what about big data?
