# BACKGROUND - 52ND STATISTICAL COMMISSION (2021)

Statistical Commission decision 2021 52/107:

- Endorsed revising IMTS 2010 and MSITS 2010, while ensuring consistency with the update of other statistical standards, such as the SNA and BOP;
- Welcomed the creation of a new task team for the revision of the traderelated standards.

# BACKGROUND - 53RD STATISTICAL COMMISSION (2022)

# The Commission was invited to express its views on:

- Horizontal (across statistical domains) and vertical integration of business and trade statistics
- The progress of TT-ITS, workflow, and research agenda
- Global core set of principal business and trade indicators

#### Commission decision 19:

- Endorsed the horizontal and vertical integration of business and trade statistics
- Welcomed the work programme, ToR and research agenda of the TT-ITS
- Encouraged the preparation of international trade indicators

# TASK TEAM ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE STATISTICS UN COMMITTEE OF EXPERTS ON BUSINESS AND TRADE STATISTICS

### Established in 2021:

- First meeting in October 2021
- A hybrid meeting in Lisbon (31 May-3 June 2022)
- Latest was the tenth meeting (June 2022)

### **Priorities:**

- Revising the international trade statistics manuals
- Integration between trade and business statistics
- Cross-cutting topics (e.g., digital trade)
- Capacity-building (maturity model, trade data tools)

- •An outline of IMTS, MSITS and possibly a common part should be developed by the end of the year.
- •A consultant will be recruited (mid 2024) for the editing of the manuals.
- •The TT-ITS emphasized prioritizing the manual track. GNs were categorized, whether required for manual track (conceptual or clarification/updated text); compilation guide; and handbook track.


# **TT-ITS: Working arrangement**

Final GNs will put forward recommendations to be included into revised concepts


Each GN will be drafted by a team of contributors led by the GN co-lead



In Oct 2020, the UN Committee of Experts on Business and Trade Statistics endorsed synergy in the between IMTS and SNA/BPM timeline and invited the establishment of a trade task team to manage the revisions



The deliverables of the TT will consist of the update of IMTS Concepts and Definition (IMTS 2025) and Manuals on Statistics of Trade in Services (MSITS 2025)



And in addition, the release of the manual on principal indicators on business and trade statistics – 2nd Volume (2024)

# THE MANUAL ON PRINCIPAL INDICATORS ON BUSINESS AND TRADE STATISTICS – 2ND VOLUME

# Objectives

- Presents a strategic view on business and trade statistics, including identifying policy needs and data gaps
- Puts forth a list of principal indicators on business and trade statistics, designed to meet users' needs in terms of better quality and increased data granularity

The indicators are intended to be able to be compiled in an internationally comparable, flexible and sustainable approach

Identifies areas for further development

• The I<sup>st</sup> volume was released this year (submitted to UN Statistical Commission)



- The I<sup>st</sup> Volume focuses on business statistics of the following areas: (endorsed by UNSC 2022)
  - Indicators on Business Dynamics, Demography and Entrepreneurship (I-I6)
  - Indicators on Globalization and Digitalization (17-38)
  - Indicators on Wellbeing and Sustainability (39-56)

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Volume on trade statistics: (aimed for UNSC 2024)

- Indicators on "vertical integration" (pure trade)
- Indicators on "horizontal integration" (trade and other policy domains)

Some overlaps are possible with "Indicators on Globalization"

# Indicators on Globalization and Digitalization

- 17. Total exports of businesses as a percentage of businesses' gross value added
- 18. Number of trading businesses by number of partner countries
- 19. Export intensity of businesses
- 20. Value of trade by foreign affiliates
- 21. Employment abroad in foreign affiliates controlled by resident enterprises as share of enterprises' total employment
- 22. Entry and exit rates for the digital economy sector
- 23. Average post-entry employment growth for the digital economy sector
- 24. Percentage of businesses with internet connection
- 25. Capital investment of businesses on ICT as a percentage of total business capital investment
- 26. Capital investment of businesses on ICT as a percentage of total gross value added

- 27. Percentage of businesses using cloud computing services
- 28. ICT-related patents (registered)
- 29. ICT-related trademarks (as a percentage of total trademarks)
- 30. Patents in AI technologies
- 31. Percentage of businesses engaged in sales via ecommerce
- 32. Value of e-commerce sales by businesses
- 33. Labor productivity growth in the ICT sector
- 34. Contribution of ICT sector to labor productivity growth
- 35. Gross value-added of ICT-related businesses as percentage of total gross value added
- 36. Employment of ICT specialists as a percentage of total employment
- 37. Percentage of businesses providing ICT-related training
- 38. Percentage of enterprises reporting hard-to-fill vacancies for ICT specialists



- A lot of significant aspects were discussed in the preparation of the GNH3 – Linking trade and business statistics;
- A short version of the GNH3 was prepared, based on the structure defined for the GN (Summary; Issues including the background and considered options and recommendations);
- It is expected that the GNH3 short version, the annex and long version of the GNH3 can serve as valuable inputs to guide the activities for developing a Manual on Integration of Business & Trade Statistics;
- Support/ endorsement from the UNCEBTS is needed and could be included in the forthcoming report of the Committee to the UN Statistical Commission.
