Underlying principles of our course

- Facilitated training not purely self-paced
- Training based on content not on instructors
- Complementary face-to-face component not only online
- Method based on *Blended Learning* not starting from zero
- Annual schedule better planning and consistency

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Taking stock

- Increasing number of participants each year
- Coverage global (210 countries or areas) and gender-balanced (48% women)
- Target group reached
- Success rate stable at 80%
- Satisfaction rate steadily increasing (2022: 91%)
- Low impact of COVID-19

- Inter-agency cooperation paid off
- Synergies and comparative advantages
- Face-to-face interaction an important component
- Compilers and users have specific needs and skills
