Components of the toolkit

Based on the SBR Maturity Model and in parallel with its update, UNSD is developing a toolkit with the following components:

- A questionnaire for self-assessment, with interactive features
- A list of training materials with mappings to the dimensions and stages of the SBR Maturity Model
- Periodic global assessment on the implementation of SBRs in countries



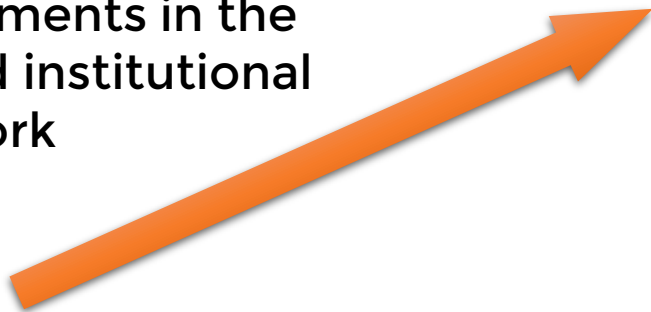
Questionnaire for self-assessment

- An online interactive tool that can assist the NSOs in their assessment on the status of development for their SBRs
- It follows a multi-dimensional approach as laid out by the SBR Maturity Model
- It is a short questionnaire (about 30 questions in total) to assess the stage of development in each dimension
- User can get instantaneous assessment on the current situation of SBR development
- No user-identifiable data are collected in the self-assessment



Structure of the questionnaire Sample questions in the first dimension

Improvements in the legal and institutional framework



Yes, it includes clauses on data protection and privacy and data exchange.

Advanced

Yes, it guarantees NSO's regular access to administrative data.

Mature

Yes, it covers business registration and economic census/surveys.

Early

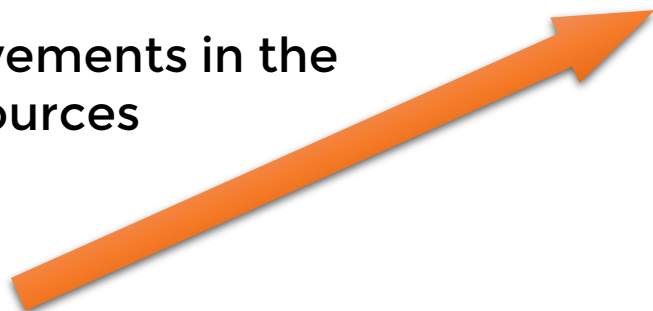
Yes, there is a legal framework or MoU that supports SBR data collection.

Improvements in the data sources

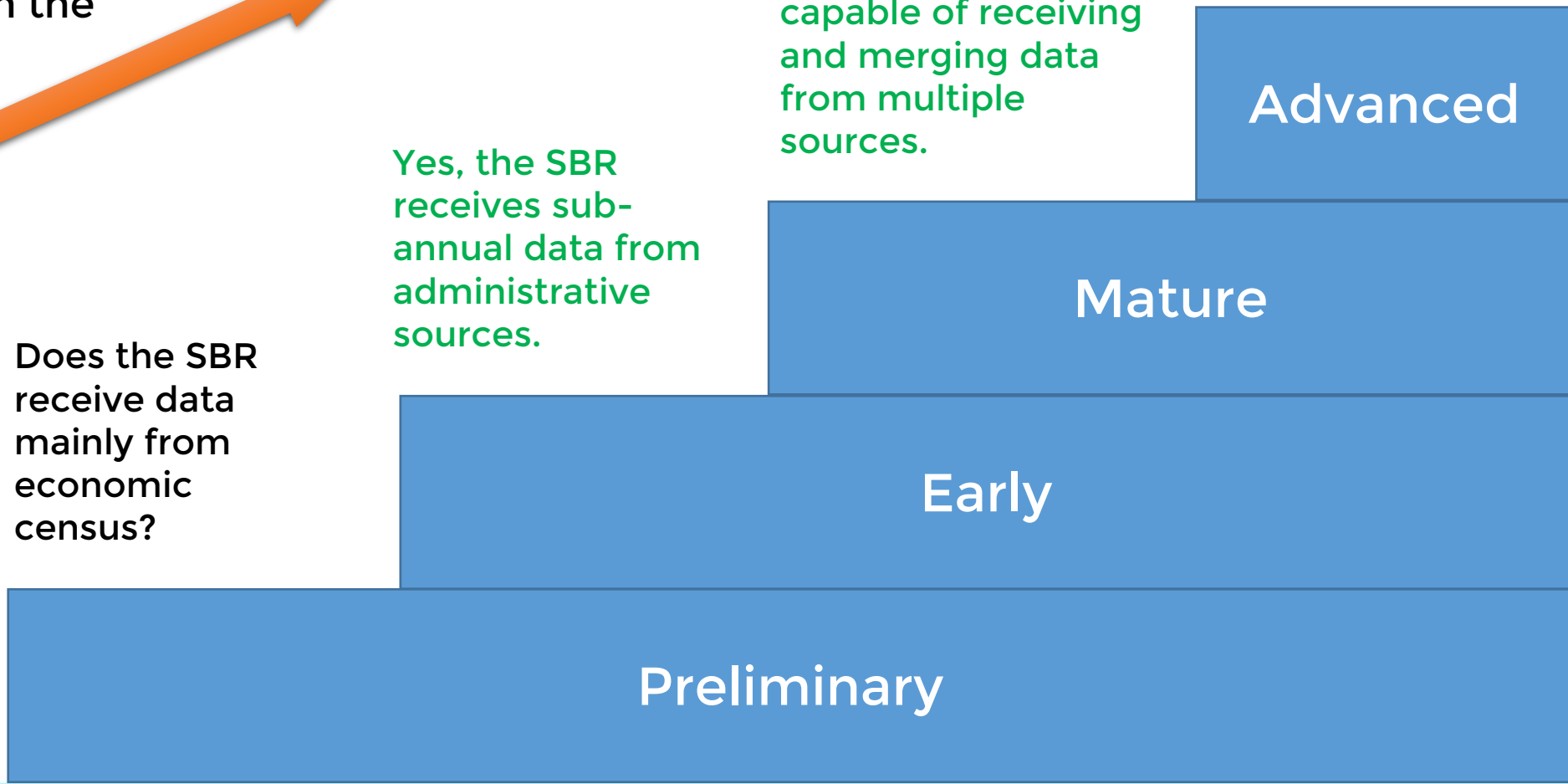


Does the SBR receive data mainly from economic census?

Is there a data source to constantly update the SBR?

Yes, the SBR receives sub-annual data from administrative sources.

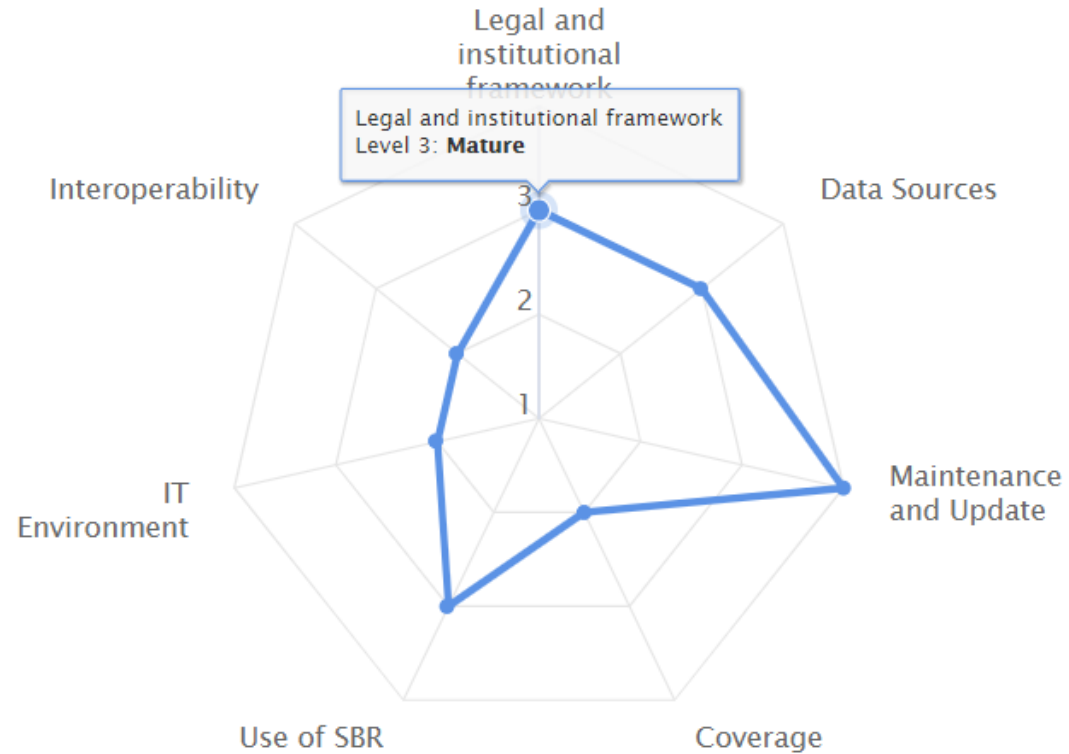
Yes, the SBR is capable of receiving and merging data from multiple sources.

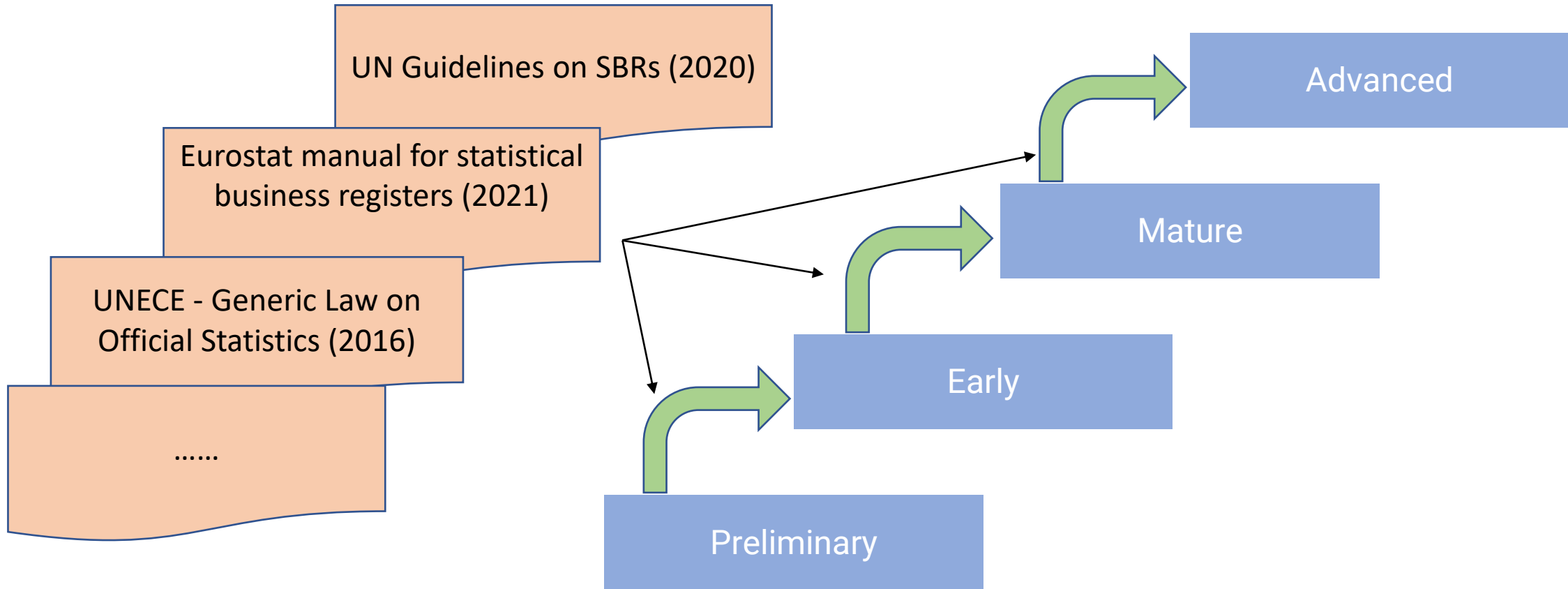


Training materials

- The Task Team on Exhaustive Business Registers and the Task Team on Capacity Building has compiled a list of training materials related to SBR development
- The list of training materials can be integrated with the self-assessment questionnaire
- Based on the results of the self-assessment, users can get a customized subset of training materials that are particularly helpful on how to improve their current SBR
- The customized set of training materials is dynamic, and will change automatically as countries move to higher stages of SBR maturity

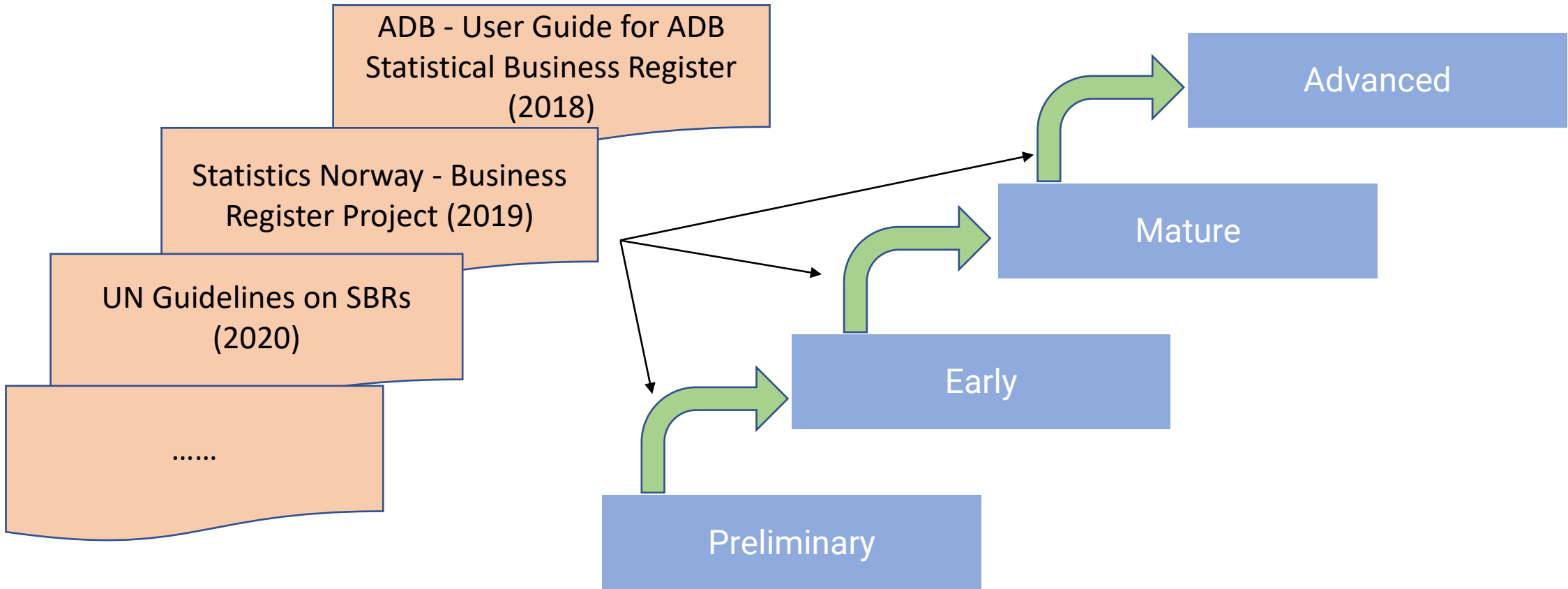

Global Assessment on the status of implementation of SBR

- The maturity model and its questionnaire can be used to conduct a regular global assessment on the status of implementation of SBRs
- The global assessment is intended to be regularly conducted (say on a 5-year cycle)
- It will assist in identifying areas where technical cooperation is needed
 - Formulate plans for capacity building
 - Develop targeted e-learning courses



What's next

- Finalize the questionnaire for the SBR Maturity Model.
- Coordinate the finalization of the questionnaire with relevant existing initiatives:
 - the Country Progress Report of the Wiesbaden group
 - the development of the Self-assessment tool for statistic legal framework being developed by the Collaborative on admin Data
- Organize training materials by the dimensions and development stages of the SBR Maturity Model.
- Finalize and publish the interactive webpage for the Maturity model
