

THE CoP: BACKGROUND (I)

CoP is UNGC's main accountability and transparency framework



CoP needs to be enhanced to strengthen UNGC's integrity and credibility



UNGC reporting needs to add value to participants

THE COP: BACKGROUND (II)

- The CoP is business annual report disclosing its work to embed the Ten Principles into their strategies and operations, as well as efforts to support societal priorities.
- The current CoP requires bizz to submit a report containing: a) a statement by the chief executive expressing continued support for the UN Global Compact, b) a description of practical actions the company has taken or plans to take to implement the Ten Principles, and c) measurement of outcomes.
- Companies that fail to report or to meet the reporting requirements over time will be removed from the initiative.

2. CHANGES IN THE NEW

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ENHANCED OBJECTIVES OF THE NEW COP

- Foster public transparency and accountability on corporate sustainability performance to help safeguard the integrity of the UN Global Compact initiative;
- > Demonstrate a company's commitment to implement the Ten Principles;
- Solution Section Compact Participants on the Ten Principles and the SDGs.
- Enhance stakeholder access to information regarding participants' implementation of the Ten Principles and contribution towards the achievement of the SDGs;
- > Promote continued learning and help drive corporate sustainability performance

THE NEW CoP: EXPECTED CHANGES

- At the center of the new CoP: a online questionnaire with granular questions on the Ten Principles and the SDGs;
- Revised CoP requirements are expected to include: a) CEO statement of support; b) a small number of required actions to be implemented by participating businesses; c) and a set of mandatory questions in the questionnaire connected to the Ten Principles to be answered on an annual basis
- An open data base for all stakeholders to access the comparable information submitted by participating businesses;
- New support services for participants;

ABOUT THE NEW COP QUESTIONNAIRE

- ✓ Mostly multiple choice questions; most questions to be optional
- ✓ Draft CoP questionnaire covers relevant topics on sustainability governance, human and labour rights, the environment and anti-corruption connected to the Ten Principles and the SDGs
- ✓ Sector-agnostic questions (sector-specific questions to be developed in the future, as needed)
- Draft questions are aligned with the UN Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights and to the extent possible to relevant existing sustainability reporting standards
- ✓ Includes indicators from other UN initiatives, e.g. UNCTAD/ISAR core indicators
- Includes questions aligned with statistics identified by the Task Team on Wellbeing and Sustainability (e.g. on water-use efficiency, energy efficiency or GHG) and will provide additional easily collectable data of interest to NSOs and other stakeholders
