







Background, objectives and scope of HIBTS

Background


- The HIBTS team has already carried out fifth editing rounds so far, which include revisions from the HIBTS team, the TT-ITS, the TT on SBR, and the TT on BDDE members
- Additionally, HIBTS has been included in two global consultations of the TT-ITS to examine the status of linking business and trade statistics in countries, and to promote participation in these efforts by sharing experiences
- Currently, the Chief Editors have made updates based on comments from the UNCEBTS Bureau members and ongoing discussions with the IMTS and MSITS Chief Editors

Objectives of HIBTS

The main objectives of HIBTS:

- Provide the conceptual and methodological framework related to the integration of business and trade statistics
- Include technical guidance for building and strengthening capacities on the MDL process
- Share country experiences related to the linking business and trade
- Guide countries to produce linking business and trade (goods and services) statistics in an international comparable manner








Status

- HIBTS concluded the 5th editing round, which includes:
 - Input from the IMF were received and included regarding the section on Institutional environment
 - Clarifications and updates based on the comments and suggestions provided by OECD and UNSD and reviewers from NSOs
 - Update of Chapters 1-4 considered the current recommendations on TEC and STEC from Eurostat manuals
- Currently, the draft of HIBTS is under a global consultation

Outstanding issues

Quality

Feedback from the IMTS and MSITS Chief Editors on the topics of Quality and Confidentiality. The topic of quality is built upon the UN National Quality Assurance Framework 2019

Institutional arrangements


It is envisaged collaboration across the two trade manuals and the revision by IMF to maintain consistency. It also addresses the issue of the sharing of data across agencies

Confidentiality

It is reviewed from two approaches, confidentiality in the input (access to data) and output (process and dissemination). It is also considered to keep homogeneity with the IMTS and MSITS manual in the language used

Gender

Coordination regarding the inclusion of a gender perspective in the trade manuals. The Handbook on Integrating Business and Trade Statistics and the Manual on International Merchandise Trade Statistics 202X Chief Editors has kept communication with the TT on BDBDE leader



Global consultation

Global Consultation of HIBTS

- The global consultation for HIBTS started on September 17th and it will conclude on October 11th. Respondents are encouraged to complete the online version of the questionnaire (SurveyMonkey)
- The Global Consultation aims to get feedback from international trade statisticians and business statisticians, and compilers of business and trade data, regarding the draft of the HIBTS
- Particularly, it is expected to receive feedback on the clarity of the elements included in the handbook and inquiry about other challenges or relevant issues not addressed yet or that requires to be complemented
- Likewise, it includes a template of national practices, with the aim to collect experiences on the integration of business and trade statistics. Respondents are invited to upload their document in the Global Consultation site





Initiative for a repository of practices


Repository of practices on linking business and trade

- The Chief Editors of HIBTS are coordinating with the UNSD team to create a repository of practices for integrating business and trade statistics. Current discussions with the UNSD are focused on the content and interface of the site that will host the repository of practices
- The repository will be based on the experience of the Country Progress Report site for the Wiesbaden Group¹, taking into account the compilation (receiving filled templates) and dissemination of country experiences

Repository of practices on linking business and trade

- To support the inclusion of practices in the repository, the HIBTS team circulated a template for national practices which is a homogeneous format where contributors can share their experience
- The template includes the contact details, the introduction, main content, closing remarks and a space for including some hyperlinks. Additionally, it contains of a set of topics for categorizing the practice, as well as it requests 5-6 keywords to ease the searching on the site
- The following slide includes an example from Mexico identifying the topic and main keywords. The final list of keywords will be constructed based on the words proposed by country experts from their templates

Suggested topics for classifying the practices

Experiences shared for the Repository


So far, there are 23 experiences on business and trade statistics integration practices from 16 countries, which correspond to:

12 of these experiences include their topics and keywords for being considered in the pilot version of the repository

Key notes on the repository on integrating business and trade statistics

- Interface and content of the HIBTS site: Discuss the hosting arrangements, topics and content with the UN-DESA trade branch for developing a first version of the repository. It is envisaged that this proposal can be the basis for elaborating other repositories within UNCEBTS
- Analyzing and organizing the experiences received: Create a list of topics and keywords based on the templates provided by contributors and reviewers
- Due to several initiatives expect to produce their own repositories, it is needed to discuss at Bureau level about the communication and coordination required to guarantee the right interconnection among different domains and topics

- It is important to mention that answers are expected from the national agencies in countries in the fields of business and trade statistics
- HIBTS will be updated based on the comments received in the Global Consultation
- Chief Editors will keep communication with the UNSD Trade Branch to discuss the next steps and the organization of the repository of practices on integrating business and trade statistics
- It is expected to deliver the white cover version of HIBTS in early 2025
