United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD)

Brief description of the organisation ¹	 Statistics Division is the central body for statistical activities in the United Nations. It is established within the Department of Economic and Social Affaires of the United Nations Secretariat in New York, USA. Initially the Division was named Statistical Office of the United Nations and in 1993 it assumed its present name - the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD). The work of UNSD is overseen by the United Nations Statistical Commission. The Commission was established in 1947 as the apex entity of the global statistical system. It is the highest decision making body for international statistical activities, especially the setting of statistical standards, the development of concepts and methods and their implementation at the national and international level. It is a Functional Commission of the UN Economic and Social Council.
Mission ²	The Statistics Division is committed to the advancement of the global statistical system. UNSD compiles and disseminates global statistical information, develops standards and norms for statistical activities, and supports countries' efforts to strengthen their national statistical systems. UNSD facilitates the coordination of international statistical activities and supports the functioning of the Statistical Commission.

Mandate	 The terms of reference of the Statistical Commission are set forth in Economic and Social Council resolution 1566 (L) of 3 May 1971, reaffirming its resolution 8 (I) of 16 February 1946, as amended by resolution 8 (II) of 21 June 1946. The Statistical Commission during its nuclear session in 1946 recommended that a Central Statistical Unit of the United Nations Secretariat be established to serve the statistical needs of all departments and constituent organs of the United Nations and become an international centre of statistical information.
Statistical work programme	 Multi-year programme of work of the Statistical Commission: The current multi-year programme covers the period 2009-2012 and was approved by the 40th session of the Commission in February 2009. UNSD functions in a two-year work programme cycle based on the approved multi-year programme of the Commission. UNSD programme of work for the biennium 2010- 2011 was considered and hold with the formation of the commission.
