Registration and Ground Passes



<u>Top left corner:</u> Grand Central Terminal (and subway station), entrances to Grand Central are on the corner of 42nd Street and Park Avenue and on the corner of 43rd Street and Lexington Avenue (the avenue between Park Avenue and 3rd Avenue.

Subway and buses are a convenient way to get around Manhattan. **MetroCard** valid for subway and bus can be purchased at subway stations. Riding the subway is generally safe even at night, especially within Manhattan.

Single: single ride ticket is \$3.00 (no transfer to bus).

Pay-per-ride: \$2.75 (\$2.50 if you add at least \$5.50 to your MetroCard)

7-Day Metro Card costs \$31.00 (unlimited ride for one week for one person)

Yellow Cab Taxis

Yellow taxis are readily available around Manhattan. While taxis are relatively expensive for a single person, they are affordable with 3 or more riders. Taxis are also a safe alternative for late night travel when train and buses can be few and far between. All taxis usually accept credit cards. Pay only what is on the meter, plus a 10% to 15% gratuity (tip for safety and good service).

<u>Caution:</u> Do not to take taxis without meters (illegal taxi) or with the meter turned off and do not use black cabs that you have not ordered beforehand using a smartphone app like Uber, Gett, Lyft, etc., as they could charge you exorbitant fares. At the airports only get onto a taxi at the official taxi stand where usually an agent should be present.

On all trips within New York City, any bridge and tunnel tolls to the destination shall be paid by the passenger, who shall be so informed before the start of the trip. On all trips within the City of New York, return tolls shall not be charged except for trips over the Cross Bay Veterans, Marine Parkway-Gil Hodges Memorial, and Verrazano Narrows Bridges. On trips beyond the City of New York, all necessary tolls to and from the destination shall be paid by the passenger. There are additional charges for crossings outside the metropolitan area and New Jersey. Passengers are required to pay one way.

Black Cabs (Uber, Uber Pool, Gett, Via, Lyft, etc.)

There are many black cabs operating in New York. Most of them are now hailed using an app like Uber, Uber Pool, Gett, Via, Lyft, etc.. Uber accounts from abroad were reported to work also in New York. So this might be a good alternative for trips within the city and to the airports. Especially when using their shared service Uber pool, where several passengers share the costs of the ride.

Money

The majority of ATMs (Automated Teller Machines) networks in New York City are linked to a network that most likely includes your bank at home. Hence, you would be able to make a cash withdrawal if you have a cash card (ATM Card) that offers **Cirrus** (<u>www.mastercard.com/atmlocator/index.jsp</u>) or **Plus** (<u>www.visa.com/atm</u>), the 2 most popular networks. There are fees and daily limits associated with withdrawing money using the above networks. Please check with your bank at home for this information and also check for any additional fees charged by the ATM operator displayed on the ATM's screen.

Travelers cheques are another good and safe alternative. But they are less and less used in New York. Be sure to keep a record of their serial numbers, so you are ensured a refund in case they are lost or stolen. The 3 most popular travelers cheques providers are **American Express** (American Express branches <u>www.americanexpress.com</u>), **Visa** (Citibank branches), **MasterCard** (Thomas Cook Currency Services).

Credit Cards are a convenient way to pay for transactions. **American Express**, **Visa** and **Master Card** (among others) are accepted virtually everywhere in New York and locals use them to pay even for very small amounts.

It is suggested that you give 18% of your total bill as a gratuity. It usually adds up to multiplying tax by two. ex) Tax = \$2.50, then tip would be $$2.50 \times 2 = 5.00 .
