

Work carried out since the last meeting of the Expert Group

- The last meeting of the Expert Group took place in June 2005
- Since then the following meetings have taken place:
 - Technical Subgroup on ISIC/CPC June 2005
 - Technical Subgroup on ISIC/CPC Oct. 2005
 - FAO meeting on agricultural products Nov. 2005
 - Technical Expert group on ISCO Nov. 2005
 - Technical Subgroup on ISIC/CPC June 2006
 - Technical Expert group on ISCO July 2006
 - Technical Expert group on ISCO Dec. 2006
- No UN Classifications Workshops have taken place during this time.



- Work carried out in these meetings contributed to the revisions of ISIC, CPC and ISCO
- In summary, the main issues addressed were as follows:
 - Technical Subgroup on ISIC/CPC June 2005
 - Finalizing ISIC structure based on EG recommendations
 - Technical Subgroup on ISIC/CPC Oct. 2005
 - Review of responses to CPC questionnaire, work on CPC structure
 - FAO meeting on agricultural products Nov. 2005
 - Review of FAO proposals and some counterproposals for agricultural products in CPC, development of a detailed CPC structure for agricultural goods, draft of HS links



- Technical Expert group on ISCO Nov. 2005
 - Identification of scope of revision, conceptual issues, review of specific occupational groups
- Technical Subgroup on ISIC/CPC June 2006
 - Review of special issues for ISIC, resulting in one structural change; Review first draft of ISIC introduction; discussion of alternate aggregations (review SNA aggregation and NPI aggregation; agree on procedure for others)
- Technical Expert group on ISCO July 2006
 - Review of conceptual framework and specific occupational groups; preparation of second ISCO questionnaire
- Technical Expert group on ISCO Dec. 2006
 - Review of responses to second ISCO questionnaire;
 preparation of final draft structure



- During this time the UN Statistical
 Commission met twice:
 - March 2006
 - Adopted the draft structures of ISIC and CPC
 - Feb. 2007
 - Agreed to the implementation plan proposal for ISIC and CPC
 - Agreed to the draft structure of ISCO-08



ISIC/CPC work

- In parallel, UNSD carried out further work on ISIC and CPC, such as:
 - Validation of explanatory notes for ISIC Rev.4
 - Development / Review of links between:
 - ISIC Rev.4 and CPC Ver.2
 - CPC Ver.2 and HS 2007
 - CPC Ver.2 and CPC Ver.1.1
 - ISIC Rev.4 and ISIC Rev.3.1



ISIC/CPC work

- Validation of explanatory notes for CPC Ver.2 (services)
- Development of explanatory notes for selected goods subclasses in CPC Ver.2
- Recoding of CPC index to CPC Ver.2 (46,000 items)
- Review of definitions provided by FAO on agricultural products
- Preparation of Alternate Aggregations for ISIC Rev.4:
 - High-level and intermediate-level aggregation for SNA purposes
 - Informal sector aggregation *
 - Information and Communications technology (ICT)
 - Non-profit institutions
 - Energy-related activities *



ISIC/CPC work

- Further development of the introduction to ISIC
 - Outstanding issues to be discussed by TSG in April 2007
 - Treatment of outsourcing
 - Review of consistency of definitions



Recap - 2005 deliverables

- At the meeting in June 2005, the EG made recommendations for future work in the following areas:
 - a) Finalization of the ISIC Rev.4 structure
 - b) Continued work on the CPC Ver.2 structure
 - c) Review of implementation assessment mechanism of international standard classifications
 - d) Review of interrelationship and interdependence of international reference classifications



Recap - 2005 deliverables

- Actions on a) and b) have been described above.
- An implementation monitoring process has become part of the ISIC and CPC implementation and will from there be applied to other classifications.
- The review of relationships between the international reference classifications is pending. It was scheduled to take place after the work on the Companion Guide to ISIC and CPC is concluded.
