Introduction

- The UN Statistical Commission, in March 2021, mandated revision of the CPC and endorsed the proposed terms of reference for establishment of a dedicated Task Team (TT-CPC)
- Task Team includes **experts** on:
 - Statistical classifications
 - Subject matter experts
 - National accounts
 - Environmental accounts
 - Trade statistics
- To ensure the classification supports the **international statistical standards**



Status of the Revision Process

- **First meeting** of the TT-CPC in August 2021
- Several virtual meetings to identify and resolve issues for the revision of CPC
- A **list of issues** was identified through a global consultation in Dec 2021-Mar 2022, including:
- Research and development
- Education services
- Cultural products
- Agriculture, forestry and fishery products
- Fertilizers and pesticides
- Food products
- Accommodation services
- ISIC revision issues

- Energy products/SIEC revision
- Impact of digitalization (e.g. (Digital intermediary platforms)
- Financial and related services products (e.g. Fintech and cryptocurrencies)
- Environmental goods and services and links with the CEA
- Waste and circular economy

- Issues from selected satellite accounts

2) Issues where the discussion has started but is still ongoing

- Waste
- Identification of existing issues from selected satellite accounts
- Impact of digitalization on CPC (e.g. Digital intermediary platforms)

Status of the Revision Process > List of Issues

3) Issues that still require discussion

- Fisheries
- Improved alignment with SIEC
- Review of definition of goods, services and other products
- Impact of the revised ISIC on CPC



Status of the Revision Process > Alternate Structures

Recurrent discussion

• Addressing thematic interests in CPC

e.g. information economy , environmental issues, energy, etc. while maintaining CPC as a <u>central</u> product classification

• Limited coding system

For each level the coding is based on 0-9, thus only 10 categories are possible; 5 levels for the classification



Status of the Revision Process > Alternate Structures

Alternate structures

• **Expansion** when more data is needed (i.e. in CPC Ver. 2.1. expansion for agriculture statistics)

Number of digits	1	2	3	4	5	6	7
CPC Level	Section	Division	Group	Class	Subclass	FAO detail	

- **Rearrangment** of entire structure using CPC as building blocks
- **Rearrangment** of a subset of CPC to reflect specific concept
 - Information Economy
 - o Green Economy



Status of the Revision Process > Alternate Structures

The TT-CPC proposes to extend CPC expansions to:

- Forestry
- Fertilizers and Pesticides
- Agri-food
- Fishery

Additional detail is added at the 6- and 7-digit level to reflect more granularity that is specific to certain domain



Next Steps

Proposed timeline revision

- Allow for a full consideration of the **outstanding issues**
- Better reflection of the impact of **ISIC revision** on classification of products
- Improved coordination with **SIEC revision** process

Revised timeline

September 2023	Finalization of revised structure
September-October 2023	Global consultation
October 2023	Endorsement by UNCEISC
March 2024	Submission of revised CPC to UNSC
