

- Regional breakdown


Western Europe & Other: 28%

Q1. What product classifications are used in your country?

 National adaptation of CPC or CPA: 	30%

 CPA/CPC + national/regional classification: 	3%
 HS/CN + national/regional classification: 	3%
HS/CN only:	3%

Other combinations:	2%



Q10. Once the product classification revision process has started, how long does it generally take to complete the revision?

Conclusions

- The vast majority of respondents are using CPC/CPA or a national/regional adaptation
- Almost all respondents note that their classification is based on CPC/CPA (and/or HS/CN)
- Most respondents note having a formal system at the national level to maintain the classification
- Over 40% of respondents note their classification has been updated after 2015
- 50% of respondents with a regular revision cycle note a 1-3 year cycle
- Once revision has started, most respondents note 1-2 years for completion
