

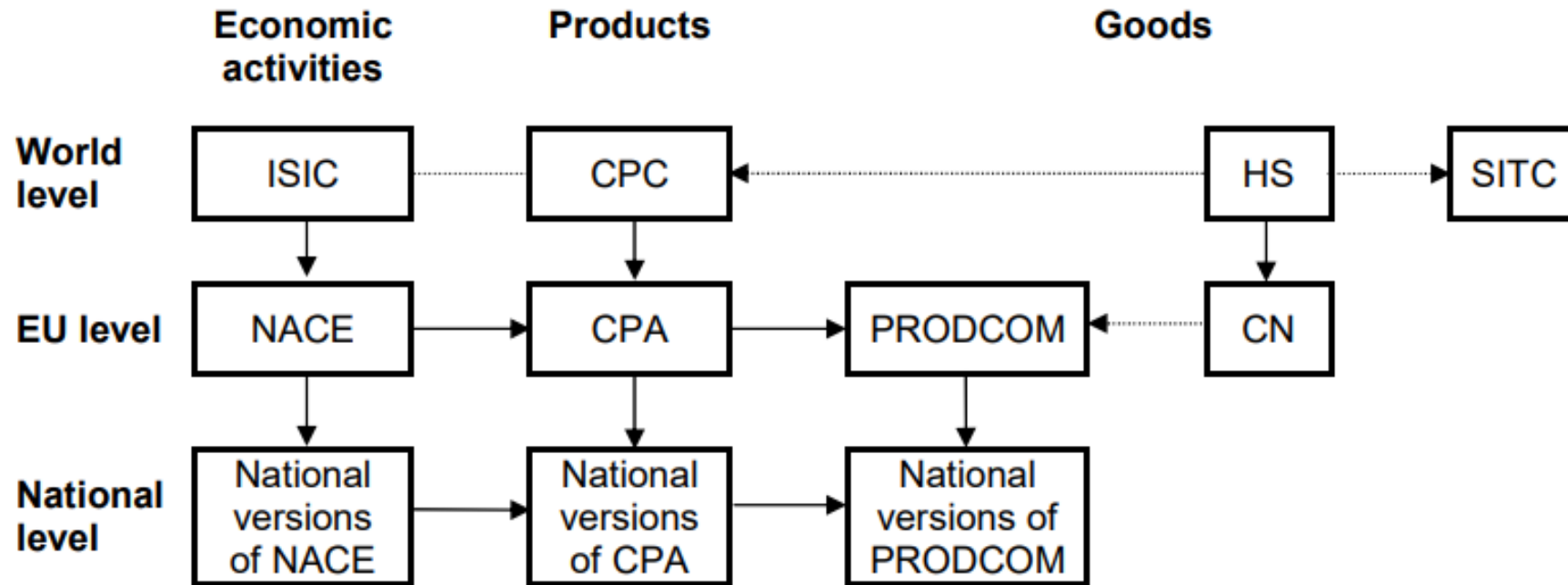

European Classification of Products by Activity (CPA)



- CPA is the reference classification of PRODCOM (classification of goods used for statistics on industrial production in the EU)
- CPA is structurally aligned to NACE
- PRODCOM and CPA are using CN building blocks, links to the CN should not be disbanded

CPA review process

What	When
Endorsement by the ESSC for launching the CPA review	May 2021
First stakeholder consultation on new CPA draft structure	July – September 2022
Analysis of all structural proposals received by the CPA review Task Force	Ongoing, until 7 November 2023
Final Consultation of the new draft CPA structure	Ongoing, until 5 November 2023
Final discussions of the new CPA structure with the Standards Working Group	December 2023
Endorsement of the new CPA structure by the ESSC	February 2024
Start of the procedure for a CPA legal act	February 2024
Work on CPA explanatory notes and correspondence tables	January 2024 – November 2024
Adoption of the CPA legal act	Fourth quarter 2024
Common date for the application for NACE Rev. 2.1 and CPA Version 2.2 (several deviations for different statistical products)	1 January 2025

CPA use case analysis

- List of statistical products which have data reporting references to CPA:
 - Business Service Statistics
 - Supply, Use and Input-Output Tables
 - Purchasing Power Statistics
 - Short-term Business Statistics (import prices, producer prices, real estate)
 - International trade in goods statistics
- Also important is the function as reference classification to PRODCOM

CPA revision criteria

- Coordination with the CPC
- Covering new emerging services resulting from technological and economic developments in the European Union
- Structural alignment of NACE and CPA (this implies the same implementation approach for CPA and NACE)
- CPA should not be more detailed than PRODCOM (scope is Section B and C and new CPA class 38.21)
